## Devotional

“Whoever has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me. And he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him.” In John 14, Jesus describes the Holy Spirit, and gives us a precious teaching of the promise He gives us. When we love Him, we in turn, are loved by God and receive the Holy Spirit to dwell in our heart. This is no “three for one” bargain deal. This is a manifestation of God’s kingdom being fulfilled in us. As educators, we may come alongside our students to guide and encourage them to reach their full potential, but God actually dwells in us. In fact, it is impossible to follow God at all unless we are led by the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is our teacher and helper (v. 26) and our comforter (v. 18 and 27). This motivates me to be pursuing a heart worthy of the indwelling of God’s Spirit. Paul describes our body as a “temple” (1 Corinthians 6:19), and we have a responsibility to maintain a proper temple. What does this look like? A heart filled with devotion and love for Jesus. In addition, it is a reminder to live actively for Him, and to remain in hope of His promises. May you be encouraged by the Helper, Teacher, and Comforter, and motivated to pursue your devotion to Jesus this week!
