Devotional

In Mark 10:27, Jesus declared, "With man it is impossible, but not with God. For all things are possible with God." In doing so he was correcting Jewish theology. Several passages of Scripture from the Old Testament show that in Jewish theology wealth and riches were evidence of God's blessing and favor (Job 1:10, 42:10, Psalms 128:1-2; Isaiah 3:10). Within the context of the passage in Mark 10, Jesus is correcting this understanding of wealth and showing that wealth can be a hindrance to entering the kingdom of God. Jesus is showing that salvation, truly knowing God, is a gift from God alone and an act that can only be established by God. With man salvation is impossible but with God anyone can be saved.




