Lecture:

The Annunciation: Transcendence Expressed through Art from The Renaissance

Dr. Kuisle will explore the symbolism and depth of meaning in the story of the Annunciation, in which the angel Gabriel appears to Mary the Virgin and gives her a startling message. The presenter will show paintings by a variety of artists from the Renaissance to demonstrate the uniqueness of each artist's attempt to express "transcendence" in his portrayal of the moment of "the annunciation." Carl Jung spoke of this as symbolizing an experience "that grips us or falls upon us as from above," an experience that is possible in our own psychological work. We will also reflect on Jung's concept of the transcendent function.

Workshop:

Transcendence in Everyday Life

In the workshop, we will discuss Jung's concept of the equality of consciousness and the unconscious, and the 'numinous' that can be experienced in dreams, synchronicities, creative activities, and everyday encounters. We will explore ways to tune in to the opposites within and around us. Participants will be invited to take part in a guided imagery. This will be followed by the opportunity to reflect, journal, and share about what psyche sends us, as well as create with clay. Please bring a journal or notebook.

Kathryn Kuisle, PhD, is a Jungian analyst with a private practice in Colorado Springs and Denver. She is a graduate of the C. G. Jung Institute in Zurich and holds a PhD in analytical psychology from Union Institute and University in Cincinnati. Dr. Kuisle is on the Board of the C. G.
