LEADERSHIP MORENO VALLEY PROGRAM

2018 – 2019 Schedule

The **LEADERSHIP MORENO VALLEY PROGRAM** brings together individuals interested in exploring the inner workings of a community as well as the unique qualities it holds. This program consists of a kickoff event, nine themed sessions and a graduation luncheon. Each monthly session occurs on the **THIRD Thursday, between September 2018 and June 2019**, and are approximately eight hours in length including lunch. The schedule is as follows:

KICKOFF LUNCHEON

September 20, 2018

Meet all the participants and get an overview of the program.

GOVERNMENT

October 18, 2018

Gain an understanding of the structure and function of various government agencies in the community including who does what at City Hall.

BUSINESS

November 15, 2018

Learn about local efforts to attract new business and retain existing businesses and future economic development plans for the community.

PUBLIC SAFETY

December 20, 2018

Several agencies provide services to residents of Moreno Valley, including Police, Fire, Animal Control, Graffiti Patrol and Citizen's Patrol. Learn who they are and the services offered.

MEDIA

January 17, 2019

Visit a media agency and learn what the media believes is important to report, how to be in control of your relationship with the media and explore some of the methods of providing information to the public.

EDUCATION

February 21, 2019

Two school districts, one community college, a private university and several providers offering technical and certificate programs provide educational services to the community. Gain an understanding of their issues and concerns and learn about the future of education in Moreno Valley.

HEALTH/HUMAN SERVICES

March 21, 2019

Moreno Valley is home to the Kaiser Permanente - Moreno Valley Community Hospital, Riverside University Health System and independent medical providers. What types of health and human care needs/services are available in the community?

NATURAL RESOURCES

April 18, 2019

How does providing utilities, including water, electricity and solid waste resources impact Moreno Valley? What is the future of water, electricity and waste management services? These questions and more will be answered.

MILITARY/MJPA

May 16, 2019

What is the impact of March Air Reserve Base and the March Joint Powers Authority on Moreno Valley and other communities? What is the future of the Base? See first hand the logistics of protecting Moreno Valley, providing services to the U.S. military and increasing local jobs.

QUALITY-OF-LIFE

June 20, 2019

From young to old, the community is interested in recreation, leisure activities, and cultural amenities that bring pleasure and satisfaction. What does the community have and what do we need?

June 27, 2019

Cap the year's program off with a special luncheon and ceremony honoring the participants of the **LEADERSHIP MORENO VALLEY PROGRAM**.
