Top Chef Marathon Success!

Our Top Chef Marathon far surpassed our fundraising goal with a total of **\$104,810 - not including Pancake Breakfast Proceeds!** We truly are grateful for the leadership of our 8th grade parents: Sara Schliesman, Tiffany Hanson, Sean Murnan and many helpers. We are also grateful for the participation of our school families! 98% of families participated in this important school fundraiser!



As a part of our Marathon celebration, we had our annual Pancake Breakfast. Close to 700 tickets were sold! Elizabeth Jensen, Carrie Lang, and Amy Weber, second grade parents, were instrumental in hosting a very enjoyable breakfast. Although the breakfast does bring in funds for Marathon, it is mainly intended to be a community event hosted and supported by our second grade parents.

Father Kevin, teachers and students were a big hit as they promoted our Marathon and explained Design for Learning to our parishioners. We received overwhelmingly positive comments from our parishioners of all ages who checked out the furniture and visited the classrooms.

Staff Reading Workshop

At a recent workshop, John Alexander, the Executive Director of Groves Academy, spoke about dyslexia and reading to our entire school faculty. Dyslexia is neurological condition that affects how language is processed. Dyslexia is not due to a lack of intelligence or a desire to learn. As John stated, "Dyslexia is an unexpected weakness in a sea of strengths."

The second half of the presentation focused on good reading instruction. John discussed the five strands of reading: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. He talked about the characteristics of good reading instruction and the literacy framework used by Groves. It was an outstanding presentation and well received by the staff. This was also a good prelude as we review our current language arts program and select resources for the 2018-2019 school year.

Design for Learning

We have been receiving rave reviews about our classroom transformations from teachers, parents, parishioners, faith formation families and especially our students! Students truly feel that these classrooms accommodate several learning styles. We are scheduled to receive our final delivery of furniture during MEA break. We will have several new desks available. In particular, the temporary stools in the third grade classrooms will be replaced with chairs. We are in the process of working with Jill Johnson, our Design for Learning designer, to begin consulting with staff regarding our remaining auxiliary spaces. These would include the library, art room, music and after care space as well as some nooks and common areas. We are referring to this as Phase II of the project. We plan to have more details about this phase of the project to include for promoting Give to the Max for this year.

Additional School Improvements!

As a part of the transformation in our classrooms, Ms. Johnson and Mr. Benson have painted white board walls that can be written on by their math students. Students are excited to be able to write on walls without getting in trouble!

Teacher and parent comments were also very positive about the portable SMART boards in the Middle School. We have also added a portable SMART board in the school library to support both school and general parish programing needs.

Standards-Based Grading

All grade levels and middle school teachers are working on creating "scope and sequence" sheets and supplement sheets for parents. The hope is that the scope and sequence will give parents an indication as to whether the material their child has been assessed on will be reassessed at a later time, or if there should be reteaching and reassessing. The supplement sheet will accompany the report card and will provide more meaning to the concepts their child has mastered, or are still developing in all subject areas. Teachers will be spending the upcoming early release working in teams on these documents, clarity and uniformity.

Overall enrollment in our parish school is currently 653 students. Our Middle School is the largest it has ever been!

K-2 - 212 students
3-5 - 225 students
6-8 - 216 students
