The Rev. Ryan Streett has accepted the call to serve as the Assistant to the Rector at St. Philip's. Ryan met his wife, Anna, while studying at Columbia International University, and they were married in 2011. Ryan served as a deacon and was ordained a priest in 2014 at Church of the Apostles in Columbia, SC. From there, he and Anna were sent to plant a church in Newberry, SC, where he has been serving for the past three years. While in Newberry, they were blessed by the birth of their daughter, Cecily, who is now 2. Ryan has a passion to see broken and wounded people find the healing grace of Jesus Christ both locally and globally; he is the co-founder of an indigenous mission agency called 10/40 Tribal Commission.

St. Philip's will welcome the Streett family on Sunday, July 23, with a "pounding" by bringing them supplies to fill their pantry such as coffee, flour, sugar, and paper products. Please save the date and plan to bring a "pound of welcome" for the Streets!

You May Have Wondered... What is LAMB, Anyway?

Every Sunday we pray for LAMB and Suzy McCall... what is LAMB anyway?

What is LAMB? The full name is “LAMB Institute,” which stands for Latin American Missionary and Bible Institute. LAMB was founded in 1999, initially as a missionary training school for Hondurans who felt the call to go to other countries for the work of the gospel.

Since that time, the Lord has led LAMB to be the hands and feet of Jesus in the inner-city of Tegucigalpa, Honduras, where the institute is based.

There are 5 major arms of ministry:

1. God's Littlest Lambs Daycare and School—A Christian school in a desperately poor and marginalized inner city with 250 children in grades 1-9.
2. Alonzo Youth Movement—Gives young people an alternative to the gangs which are rampant in the city. Soccer is the primary tool, along with Bible clubs, for serving 200 boys and girls.
3. New Life Home—A safe-house ministry for sexually trafficked girls. There are currently 8 girls who live and are protected in the New Life Home safe-house, receiving love and healing in Jesus' name. Tegucigalpa is, sadly, a major thoroughfare for traffickers.
4. God's Littlest Lambs Children's Home—Located 45 minutes outside of Tegucigalpa, God's Littlest Lambs is home to 60 formerly neglected and abused children. This year marks

the 10th year of operation for the home, and the first year to have 6 students who have grown up at LAMB now in transition to university or technical training.

5. Microcredit program—Provides “micro” loans to very poor, mostly single, women who have started businesses. Currently 450 families

are benefitting from the hard work of these women, who are able to feed and clothe their children.

Who is Suzy McCall? Suzy is the founder of LAMB. She was raised in Barnwell, SC, and attended the College of Charleston. She came to Christ through the ministry of Saint James Church when she was in college. She has been in Honduras since 1990 and considers it her home now. She has 9 Honduran children of her own with one grandchild! However, she is “Mami Suzy” to all of the children at LAMB.

What is St Philip's connection with LAMB? Suzy was on staff at St Philip's as Director of Christian Education when God called her to the mission field in 1990. She was “sent out” from St Philip's. There are many people at St Philip's who love and support LAMB, as well as many people who are currently or who have served in the past on the US LAMB Board.

Please keep LAMB in your prayers—that God will be mightily glorified as countless precious lives in Honduras are changed by the grace and power of our Lord Jesus Christ.
