Honduran Medical Mission Partners Pray for St. Philip's

The last Honduran medical mission trip was especially rewarding. Dr. Reyna Duran, a longtime Honduran partner with the St. Philip's team, arranged for us to serve with the Pastors' Association of Tegucigalpa. They had been praying for such an opportunity. They could identify the villages in greatest need. When we held a clinic in these selected locations, the pastors were there working with us.

In each clinic, the pastors set up a station at which people could hear the Gospel and be provided with a New Testament. Because each clinic was in a church and because the pastor of that church was present, both short-term and long-term spiritual follow-up could be arranged.

Prayer is an integral part of the St. Philip's medical mission. At the end of every medical examination, the doctor asks the patients if it would be permissible to pray with them. But for the extremely rare exception, the patients are very receptive and very appreciative.

When Reyna was in Charleston a few weeks ago, she was so happy to visit St. Philip's. She had wanted for years to thank St. Philippians for the powerful work that their support has made possible in her country. While she was here, I shared with her the TEC situation. After she returned to Honduras, Reyna sent this encouraging information:

Every Saturday at 5:00 am, members of the Pastors' Association of Tegucigalpa, along with other intercessors, go to El Picacho Hill to pray for Honduras. (There is on El Picacho Hill a gigantic statue of Christ.) Please let the pastors and brothers and sisters of St. Philip's Church know that this group has added the TEC situation to their prayer list!

These are serious men and women of prayer. We at St. Philip's are blessed to have them pray faithfully for us every Saturday morning. They send these words to us— “May the Lord give you justice and keep you strong in His ministry and faithful to His word.”




