What is CenteringPregnancy?

CenteringPregnancy brings together pregnant women with similar due dates for group prenatal care. This type of care has three main components: health assessments, education and support.

What does CenteringPregnancy in Butler County look like?



- Each pregnant woman enrolled in Centering is assigned to a group of 8-12 pregnant women who are due around the same time
- Centering moms-to-be participate in a "circle up" with providers and staff in a comfortable setting after leaving the exam room.
 This is led by a trained facilitator and allows pregnant women to share their experiences and learn from other pregnant women who are going through similar experiences

- Experts are brought in to speak on important topics
- Partners or significant others are always welcome at Centering appointments
- Snacks and drinks are served
- Centering facilities in Butler County provide on-site daycare and transportation to and from their sites
- Clients have 10 scheduled prenatal visits with each visit lasting 90 minutes to two hours (as opposed to 10-15 minutes in traditional prenatal care)
- Pregnant women receiving CenteringPregnancy care have confidential health assessments i.e. one—on-one consultation with their health provider
- A community health worker is assigned to each client to support them throughout their pregnancy until the baby is one year old.

What are the benefits of CenteringPregnancy?

- <u>CenteringPregnancy improves birth outcomes: published research</u> studies show that women enrolled in Centering have healthier babies and Centering addresses the racial disparity in infant mortality
- Centering empowers pregnant women by allowing them to participate in their care
- Moms enrolled in Centering are more self-confident and better prepared for labor, delivery and the care of their infants
- Pregnant women enrolled in Centering spend 10x more time with their provider than they would with other types of prenatal care
- Pregnant women enrolled in Centering report higher satisfaction with their prenatal care, and this makes them more likely to keep their prenatal care appointments

 Centering provides social support to pregnant women and enables them to build relationships with other women who are going through similar experiences
