How Empathy Heals Trauma

The more empathy a child receives, the more whole he becomes and the more his brain integrates. Participants will understand that relationships are relaxing and rewarding. Through empathic responses to the child, relationships are built and nurtured, leading to healthy brain development. Brains grow best when they are face to face, eye to eye, mind to mind, and heart to heart. Literally wiring the brain for willingness and impulse control.

Participants will review different forms of childhood distress caused by trauma and toxic stress. As well as, how different brain states react to those stressors in the child's life. Participants will explore how empathy they received growing up; Ignoring, Saving, Punishing, Dismissing, and/or Coaching, influences the type of relationships they have with children today. Participants will learn how to distinguish the different levels of cognitive empathy and how to respond to a child seeking either information or understanding.
