**HOW KIDS LEARN ABOUT RACE AND HOW ADULTS CAN HELP  
SAVE THE DATE AND INVITE A FRIEND**

On **Sunday, November 5, from 12:30-2:00pm**, Covenant's Christian Formation and Mission Outreach Committee will be hosting a conversation led by Professor Erin Winkler from UW-Milwaukee on this important topic. This is meant for anyone with kids in their lives – parents, grandparents, teachers, mentors, friends, etc.

A short description: There is a myth in popular culture that children are "colorblind" or don't notice race. This leads many parents, families, and educators to avoid discussing race and racism with young children or to be unsure how to best do so.

In this session, Dr. Erin Winkler will review the current research on young children's understandings of race, including how ideas about race form, what children learn and when, why we see changes at various ages, why all of this matters, and how parents, families, and educators can help children understand racial identity, racism, and racial inequities in age-appropriate ways that empower their children.
