From the Back of the Bus to the Top of the Agenda

Anat Hoffman will discuss the most recent developments on segregation and exclusion of women in Israel as a result of increased demands for more modesty in the public sphere in order to adjust to religious standards. The exclusion of women "for God's sake" has become a litmus test for the infiltration of ultra-Orthodox norms into state definitions of religious requirements in the public sphere and exclusion and looks at the remaining challenges in this area.

Ms. Hoffman is an Israeli activist and is the director and a founding member of *Neshot HaKotel*, also known as *Women of the Wall*. She is a former member of the Jerusalem City Council. In 2013 *Haaretz* named her "Person of the Year," and the *Jerusalem Post* listed her fifth among its list of 50 Most Influential Jews for forcefully and successfully bringing the issue of women's rights at the Kotel to the "forefront of the consciousness of world Jewry."
