

FBC-Huntsville - Syrian Refugee Project in Jordan

Dental & Medical Emphasis--October 22-30, 2017

Background: The Syrian refugee crisis has been called “greatest humanitarian disaster since World War II”. However this unprecedented crisis has created unprecedented opportunities to minister in the name of Jesus Christ to people who desperately need encouragement

First Baptist Church Huntsville, in partnership with Global Outreach International, with International Mission Board, and with a Jordanian Baptist church, is helping provide education, food, clothing and other resources to 200 Syrian refugee children, most of whom have never been to school previously.

Our team will be comprised of medical doctors, nurses, dentists, hygienists and others who will provide arts and crafts for the children at the school. We will also distribute food parcels and hygiene kits to these children’s families. (We also hope to do some painting and other maintenance projects at the school.) Our personal involvement will enhance the status of our Jordanian Christian partners and help them open doors for the gospel.



Proposed Schedule:

Sunday, October 22: Depart U.S.

Monday, October 23: Arrive Amman Jordan--transfer to Ajloun Baptist Conference Center.

Tuesday, October 24: Clinics at Northern school

Wednesday, October 25: Clinics at Northern school

Thursday, October 26: Morning clinics at Ajloun Baptist School; drive to Eastern school

Friday, October 27: Morning Bible-storying; afternoon clinics at Eastern school

Saturday, October 28: Clinics at Eastern school

Sunday, October 29: Clinics at Eastern school; transfer to airport for late departure

Monday, October 30: Return to the U.S.

Estimated cost: \$800 plus airfare (\$1300 estimate).

(We need doctors, nurses, dentists, hygienists and also lay people for this project.)
