Join MountainTrue and the Green Riverkeeper at the Purple Onion in Saluda on Tuesday, February 20th from 5:30 to 7:30 as we screen RiverWebs, Freshwater Illustrated's award-winning documentary about river ecosystems and the science that explores them. This film follows the life and work of Dr. Shigeru Nakano as he attempted to

understand how streams and forests depend on each other and his team who carried on this work after his tragic death. RiverWebs illustrates how the movements and behaviors of insects, in both the stream and the forest, influence their predators, like fish, bats, birds, and spiders.

Stick around after the screening for a presentation about how MountainTrue monitors for stream quality in WNC and how you can get involved in our Stream Monitoring Information Exchange (SMIE) program. We will wrap up the evening with a Q&A with the Green Riverkeeper MountainTrue's Water Quality Administrator and some current SMIE volunteers. protracted court battle with Morris Levy, a narcissistic Mafia front-man working within the 1970's NY

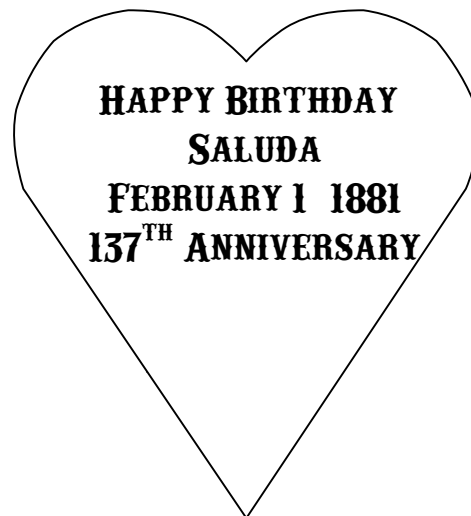

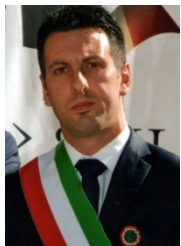

At a formal ceremony at the Carunchio City Hall, the official documents were presented making Saluda and Carunchio "Sister Cities." Now it is OUR TURN! 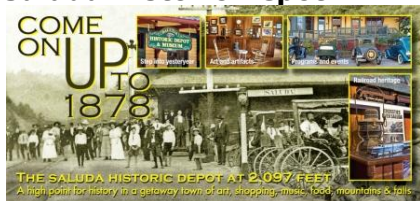

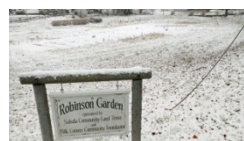

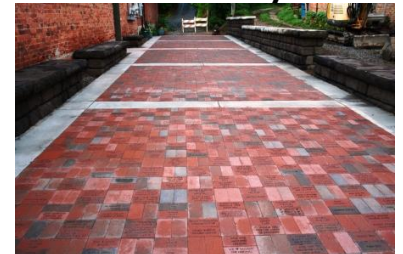

Foundation Funds Duke TIP, Education Investments

The Polk County Community Foundation is pleased to announce that full scholarships will be available for qualifying students in Polk County and Landrum to attend Duke University Talent Identification Program (Duke TIP) Summer Studies camps in 2018 and 2019. Interested students must be in the seventh or ninth grade in 2018 and 2019 to be eligible for a merit scholarship to attend Summer Studies camps in those years. The Foundation has not secured funding for merit scholarships in 2020 or subsequent years, but is actively pursuing all opportunities to continue this extraordinary program. Duke TIP is dedicated to serving academically talented students by working with students, families, and educators to identify and help

students reach their highest potential. Duke TIP students are invited to take either the SAT or the ACT college entrance exams as seventh graders and those with qualifying scores may apply for the Summer Studies Program. These three-week camps occur on college campuses across North Carolina and Georgia and allow students to take part in interactive, inquiry-based courses that are equivalent to semester-long college courses. Beginning in 2013, the Foundation's Board of Directors voted to approve a three-year pilot program to completely fund local middle and high school students' attendance at Duke TIP Summer Studies camps. Five years later, more than 125 full scholarships have been awarded to students in Polk County and Landrum who qualified for Duke TIP's Summer Studies Programs and student interest continues to grow.

Students and their families have overwhelmingly reported that the intellectual and social growth Duke TIP provided was a positive force in their lives, with students characterizing the experience as the "highlight" of their summer and "life-changing." Students have also stated that this program boosted their confidence, bringing some out of their shell by providing an environment in which they better fit in socially. Parents have also noted the positive influence of this program, including one parent who stated that her child came back from the experience more self-assured which created a positive ripple effect in her entire family.

In addition to supporting Duke TIP scholarships, the Foundation provides a variety of funding for other educational programs, including support for:

- Polk County Schools Summer Seminar camps where local teachers lead week-long seminars for local students at no cost.
- Professional development trainings and conferences for local teachers and school guidance counselors.

- Student intern programs at local nonprofit organizations and at the Polk County High School Farm.
- A college advisor at Polk County High School and Early College.
- The band program at Polk County High School so all students may play in the band, regardless of their ability to pay for this extracurricular activity.
- Artist-in-residence programs at O.P. Earle Elementary and Landrum Middle schools, which culminate in "Kessler Cultural Evening" community receptions.

By providing funding for these programs and many others, the Foundation seeks to enrich the lives of all local students, their families and the community. 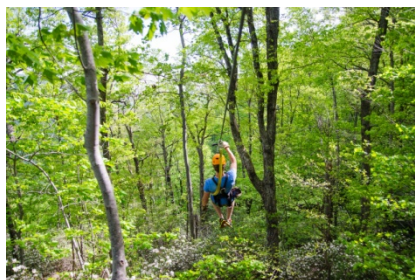

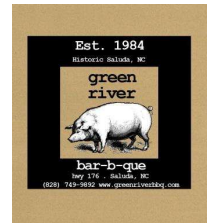

Saluda's Centennial Flashback

Saluda turns 137 on February 1, 2018 and to remind Saludians of what it was like when Saluda celebrated its 100 year centennial anniversary February 1, 1881, here's one of the opening remarks by Mayor E Cater Leland, Jr. After a birthday celebration and open house at City Hall, the town planned celebrations throughout the year.

Centennial Program August 8-9, 1881

This is just one of many speakers on the program that day.



Mayor E Cater Leland, Jr:
This is truly a special day for Saluda, and we welcome all of you here. Saluda is a special place to

each one of us, especially the residents and I'm sure it is to all of our summer visitors and all of the tourists that come in and out throughout the summer months and even in the winter to enjoy the "four seasons" that we have here. I would like to tell everyone in Saluda that we feel that Saluda is not just a place to live, but it is a way of life. It is a small peaceful community where everyone can be friendly with their neighbors...where you can say "hi" to everyone up and down the street and everyone always greets you and you'll feel like one big family. We welcome all of you here today to be a part of this family. Saluda...we have strived to keep it as it was a hundred years ago. Because all of you who have been here over the years know that it hasn't changed much, and this is the way we like it.

We hope that all the people that are here and those who visit with us will strive to keep it that way. As I've said in the past, if we want the things a big city has, we

can always go to the big city and enjoy those things. Then, we know we can come back to Saluda where it is calm and peaceful and sit on the porch and feel the breeze and know that we are in a special place.

That is the way we feel about Saluda today, the city fathers and most of the residents feel this way and we hope to keep it this way throughout the next hundred years....and on into the future.

We appreciate everyone coming today. We have some special guests here today we'd like to recognize and let them say a few words. We appreciate them coming. Mildred Barringer, Chairman of the Henderson County Commissioners is here. As many of you may know, half of Saluda used to be in Henderson County until 1903 when it was all moved into Polk County. We are right on the line and we feel Henderson County is as much a part of our home as Polk County. We're sorta' right in the middle and we have divided loyalties.

We are grateful to her for coming down and we'll have her say a few words at this time...Mrs. Barringer.

Mrs. Barringer:
Thank you Mayor. Happy Birthday Saluda! On behalf of the Henderson County Board of Commissioners, I want to say that it's a thrill to be here today to have a part in this Anniversary...this 100 year anniversary. You know, I'm a mountaineer from Kentucky and I grew up in a railroad town and when I get around a railroad like this, I get very excited. And I like history! And the history of Saluda excites me very much!

I always say in order to know where you're going, you have to know where you've been. If you know where you've been, you know where you are. And then you know where you're going...So this is what the history of Saluda means to this community.

I want to say today that I'm very grateful to the people who built these railroad tracks. I'm very grateful today to the people and I'm sure many lives were lost and it wasn't easy to build the railroad up the Saluda Mountain and through the pass. Many times there were wrecks and the storms came and the tracks were out and it wasn't easy to get the trains up the mountain and through all this. There has been a price paid for the progress that has been made in this area.

We're grateful for Saluda because of the continuity here, the continuity with the past, the continuity with now and the continuity with the future; we want to say today we're grateful for you because you are our good neighbors.

Over in Henderson County, the train would not have arrived there had it not been for the people who are working hard here and when the train arrived in Hendersonville it began to bring people in from all over the south and from everywhere. And we have the opportunity to be host to many people's just as you have. You have been gracious hosts down through the years.

In studying the history of Hendersonville and Henderson County, I've seen many pictures of the big hotels that were there. There are guests houses scattered everywhere. People came and built their summer homes there. People came and they liked what they saw and they liked what they felt and they went back and told about the good things in our part of the country. And so today, we are fast becoming a "retiree Mecca."

So we are indebted to you people here. We are so grateful for your helpfulness, for your friendliness and for your neighborliness.

So we say now, congratulations...best wishes for the future. We're grateful for the heritage that has been passed down to this area. So let's join

hearts and hands in passing this wonderful heritage on to those who will come after us. Thank you so much...it's good to be here.

Mayor Leland:

On behalf of the Saluda Centennial Committee and the City of Saluda. I would like to present Mrs. Barringer a copy of our History Book, Saluda, North Carolina, 100 years, and would ask her to place it in the Henderson County Library for future reference.

Tucked Away Treasures

Tucked away in various places in Saluda are many

wonderful trees. Some of these special trees are natives and others are non-natives. Some were planted long ago by persons long forgotten and others were allowed to naturalize in place. All, however, are part of the natural legacy to be appreciated today by all of us whether native, new comers, or visitors.

The Pacolet Area Conservancy, now merged with Conserve Carolina, undertook a project spanning several years in the early 1990s to promote conservation of the area's natural heritage by seeking out and listing noteworthy tree specimens as "Treasured Trees." During two periods of this project, two Saluda residents, Dave Prudhome and I, were instrumental at different times in the effort to identify and list outstanding specimens in the town.

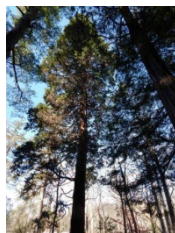
The "Treasured Trees" noted in this article are but a few of the many in our town which appear on the conservancy's list and which make Saluda such a green haven. As you seek them out, you might ponder the lives of those who have made their contribution to our natural heritage and, at the same time,

you may wish to think about what your contribution to that legacy might be.

The first concentration of "Treasured Trees" on the Conservancy's list that are easily accessible are to be found at Ivy Terrace on Main Street. There are eight listed trees at this location: 2 California incense cedars (*Calocedrus decurrens* California), 2 China firs (*Cunninghamia lanceolata*), a Norway spruce (*Picea abies*), an umbrella magnolia (*Magnolia tripetala*), a red maple (*Acer rubrum*), and an Eastern hemlock (*Tsuga Canadensis*). These trees date from the early 1890s when Capt. W. G. Henson of Charleston built Ivy Terrace as a summer retreat for his family.

A second location that is particularly well endowed with noteworthy

specimens is the grounds of the Church of the Transfiguration on Charles Street. Trees of special note there include a dawn redwood (*Metasequoia glyptostroboides*) planted in the early 1970s as a memorial to a Gen. Myer—a WWII veteran who spent several summers in Saluda in his later years, a Norway spruce (*Picea abies*), a northern red oak (*Quercus rubra*), and a red maple (*Acer rubrum*) in the lower church



yard. Two additional species of note here are several Eastern white pines (*Pinus strobus*) and an American holly (*Ilex opaca*). One additional noteworthy tree can be seen across the driveway that the church shares with Charles Street Garden. This chestnut oak (*Quercus prinus*) is the second largest of this specie to be found on the PAC listing.



Yet a third location that provides a concentrated display of "Treasured Trees" is to be found near the corner of Henderson and Gaffney Streets. In this instance, they are all of one specie—the tulip poplar (yellow poplar) (*Liriodendron tulipifera*). Five stately specimens can be viewed from this corner by looking up Gaffney and down Henderson. Several additional specimens no less worthy of being listed exist within the same two blocks.

As a footnote, floating around Saluda there is a panoramic photograph taken from Smith Hill at the end of the nineteenth century or the very beginning of the twentieth century. As far as the eye can see, what is now Saluda had been clear cut with only a few mature trees remaining here and there. As the lumber companies left, real estate developers arrived and parcels were sold to folks hungry for land on which to build a summer getaway. Saluda rapidly came into its own and nature healed its wounds.

Again, what will be the legacy for Saluda's future generations: a landscape sterile, predictable, and devoid of magnificent specimen trees or one rich in all of nature's variety?
