Kermit Lynch Wine Tasting At the Purple Onion Tuesday, November 6 @ 6:30 PM

The Purple Onion will host a wine tasting on November 6 at 6:30 just in time to stock your cellar for the holidays. The tasting will feature wines from Kermit Lynch, wine importer, author, winemaker and pioneer in the wine industry. Lynch received the James Beard Foundation's Award as wine professional of the year, was knighted by the French Government with their prestigious Legion d' Honneur and received the Veuve Clicquot award for his book, Adventures on the Wine

Route. He has had an enduring influence on the wine industry because of his focus on small, artisan producers who make authentic wines expressive of their terroir and his early practice of using refrigerated shipping containers for importing wine. The cost for the tasting will be \$49 (plus tax and gratuity) and will include a taste of seven different wines and delicious food chosen to pair with them. Nick Demos, CWE, advanced Sommelier and wine specialist from Tryon Distributing will be on hand to talk about the wines. 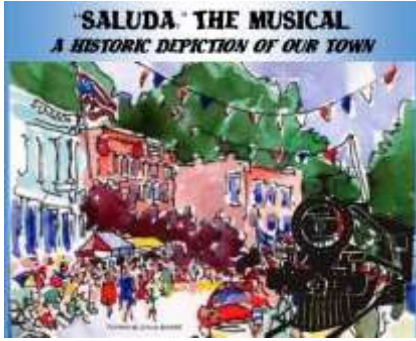

First Heritage Musical Premieres in Saluda



The Saluda Historic Depot Theatre Troupe is producing Saluda's first musical to be premiered on November 17, 2018. The production will depict Saluda's historical progression from the time the Cherokee Indians settled in the land of "green corn" until today. The original play was written by Corinne Gerwe in collaboration with members of the newly-formed Young Acting Krew "YAK" of the Saluda Historic Depot Theatre Troupe, with a musical score written by Dan Foster to be performed by his band, the Radio Rangers.

Corinne Gerwe, who with Bill Jameson co-founded the theatre troupe, recalls attending a Saluda Historic Depot board meeting during a brain-storming session on how the Depot could contribute toward bringing back "Railroad Day" in Saluda. Many remembered when Saluda celebrated this "ole timey" day when townspeople dressed in costume from the early-time era. "I began concentrating on developing this idea into a theatrical event focused on Saluda's heritage and railroad history by including children of Saluda interested in the performing arts. The Young Acting Krew had just been formed, and it seemed the right time to do this. The kids were so excited about creating a heritage play, they have since thrust the idea to realization," says Corinne.

Corinne is an author of several fiction and non-fiction novels, three of which are a series of murder mysteries set in a small town much like Saluda. Her latest mystery, "The Silent Scream of the Straw Man" has just been released. She has been a contributing board member and supporter of the Depot since its inception.

Dan Foster is a singer/songwriter based in Atlanta, Georgia. "Saluda Grade" was written by Dan after walking around Saluda before performing at the Purple Onion. He noticed the historical marker describing the remarkable, legendary Saluda Grade. In 2009 the song was featured on an album by High Cotton which spent several weeks on the Georgia top 20 Roots music charts. Dan rearranged the song for the play with his current group, The Radio Rangers, in addition to new songs featuring acoustic music with strong vocal harmonies. Writing melodic songs that tell a good story is Dan's passion.

"The history of Saluda is unique but shares a heritage with so many communities across our country. The railroads were the backbone of our country's growth and touched so many people and communities. I believe the wisdom to move forward is provided by the struggles of our past. I am honored to help in this small way in the celebration of Saluda history. Saluda is a special place," said Dan Foster.

In addition to YAK and the adult Bell Tower Players, there are many others involved in this community-wide production. "The town is excited about this musical and volunteers have jumped in to give their talents and time to costume designing, building stage sets and props, to be extras, do makeup, plan sound and lighting, and video/filming

and for cameo appearances of the towns historians and legends," says Corinne.

The production team and the Saluda Historic Depot board hope that everyone who is willing and able will attend this "One Night Only" performance. Tickets will be \$10 for everyone 12 years and older and purchased at the door. Children under 12 will be free. Special group arrangements can be made to purchase tickets by calling Corinne. They encourage everyone to put this on their calendars now because you won't want to miss this one-time historical story of Saluda told in a musical format.

The performance will be held at the Party Place & Event Center and owners Bob and Linda Whitaker granted a special concession on the regular event price for the use of the facility. The Party Place & Event Center is at 221 Friendship Church Rd., Saluda, NC. Performance will start at 7pm. Doors open at 6pm.

The Saluda Historic Depot Theatre Troupe was formed to provide a forum for a variety of theatrical performances reflecting the creative spirit of our community. The goal is to produce plays that will include those from legitimate theater, historic depictions of Saluda's rich history, and literary and poetic readings; all will demonstrate local artistry and talent. The Saluda Historic Depot will provide the setting for presentations suitable for its locale and will partner with other venues for settings suitable for each production.

Sponsorships for the Playbill are available; \$200 for major sponsor, \$25 for all other sponsors. Your name will be printed on the Playbill as a sponsor of the musical.

The musical will benefit the Saluda Historic Depot, a non-profit dedicated to making the historic train station into a museum in order to highlight the history of the railroad, Saluda's downtown, its people, and the history of its natural resources.

Book Signing by Wilmot Irvin

Wilmot Irvin has a new book out! A self-described lawyer by day and novelist

by night, Irvin is known to many in Saluda already. His first novel, *Jack's Passage*, was set in our mountain town. As a boy he spent summers here, and caught the Saluda bug early. He and his wife Jeannie, who is an artist, have a home on Walnut Street where Wilmot has done much of his writing over the past two decades. They have three grown children and an eleven-year-old, and family relationships is a theme that runs deep in Irvin's fiction.

Saluda Train Tales November 16, 2018 S. Alex Salley Tales of



Saluda
S Alex Salley was born in Saluda in 1932 to Dr & Mrs. E M Salley and entered

Saluda School in 1939. Being well prepared by the Saluda School System, he entered Clemson College in 1951. He transferred to Alabama Polytechnic Institute in 1953, graduating in civil engineering (1955) and mechanical engineering 1956. After serving in the U.S. Navy from 1957-1977, he completed a Master of Civil Engineering at NC State in 1979 and was employed by the largest family owned engineering and

construction company in the U. S. from 1980-1998. Mr. Salley returned to Saluda in the fall of 1998.

Growing up in Saluda, Mr. Salley will recall for the audience "how things were done" in Saluda in the late 30s, during WW II and through the 40's. He will take the audience back in time and tell the story of the day the post office safe was blown up and contents stolen, telling how it was done and how the criminals were never caught.

Alex grew up in a time when families sat on their front porches, boys hunted rabbits and grouse whenever they could, walked everywhere on foot, and an observant teenager pretty much knew what was happening around town when their parents were too busy trying to make a living to notice. And, Alex has an excellent memory. Put those attributes together and you have a man who has enough memories about Saluda to write a book, one that all of us would read cover to cover with delight.

Alex's father was a doctor in Saluda for 25 years serving Southern Railroad for 50 years.

Play at Tryon Little Theater

"Dancing at Lughnasa" is described by Frank Rich of the New York Times as "a theatrical masterpiece of beauty and poignancy...it strikes deep chords that words cannot begin to touch". It's a play about five sisters, one Irish summer and the boy who remembers it all.

Michael Mundy was seven years old during this summer in Ballybeg, near Donegal, Ireland. We see it through his eyes now as a grown man, visiting his old homestead where he grew up with his mother and her four sisters. They are a close-knit family with diverse personalities: the devout Catholic, the cheeky joker, the dreamer, the quiet contemplative one, the disenchanted one. And Michael's uncle, the elderly father Jack, has returned from years in Uganda—a very changed man.

This particular summer Michael sees his father – a travelling salesman who never did marry his mother and who pops in and out of their lives on his own terms. He announces he's leaving Ireland to join the International Brigade and fight in the Spanish Civil War. There's a sense that things are about to change.

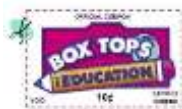

Bells for Peace, Veterans' Day 2018



A World War I Remembrance

On the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918, the first World War ended as the guns fell silent. Nations mourned their dead and collectively called for an end to all wars. The United States Congress later designated Armistice Day (now Veterans' Day) to honor and promote peace.

The North Carolina Department of Natural and Cultural Resources has invited all 100 counties in the state to participate in a bell-ringing effort to commemorate the Armistice of 1918 and has encouraged the Historic Saluda Committee to spread the word in our area. Bells of all shapes and sizes on churches, schools, government buildings and even hand-held bells are to be tolled eleven times at 11:00 am on Sunday, November 11 to remember the hope of peace.

The U.S. World War I Centennial Commission calls their commemoration of the signing of the Armistice, "Bells for Peace," and encourages groups taking part to conclude ceremonies either quietly or with the playing of taps, with a hymn or a poem or a service of choice.

More than four million American families sent sons and daughters to serve in uniform during the Great War. 116,516 U.S. soldiers died from combat and disease. Another 200,000 were wounded. More than 350,000 African Americans served in the U.S. Military, as did Native Americans and members of other minority groups. For the first time, women joined the ranks of the U.S. Armed Forces. Many served in the Red Cross, the YWCA and other volunteer organizations.

Speaking of Hog Killing Time

Each year we raised and fattened two or three hogs for butchering in the fall, then waited for a strong cold front to move in, usually in late November or early December. The cold air meant the meat would not be susceptible to spoilage during the butchering. On the day of the event, my job was to rise at three or four o'clock in the morning and start a fire under a fifty gallon drum of water so that it would be steaming come daylight. Once or twice, I was allowed to take down one of the hogs (still part of male bonding) which meant shooting them between the eyes at close range. As a child, this was always distasteful to me, in part because I viewed them as pets after having fed them for almost a year. Once the hogs were bled, they were hoisted by their back legs onto an A-frame device for gutting. There was always plenty of experienced help willing to cut up the meat. Usually three or four local men, each wielding his own razor sharp knife, would work for meat in lieu of money. I'm not sure why, but the hog bladder was a sought after prize for us kids to play with. We would blow them up like a small balloon, tie off the neck with a long string and run around the yard with our hog bladder balloons bouncing along behind. Once the hogs were gutted and completely bled, they would be laid out onto pieces of lumber or tin for removal of the hair from the skin. The scalding water made this removal process easier, just like shaving facial hair.

Certain pieces of the hog were usually cooked and served for lunch that day, the idea being that they had the best flavor

when eaten fresh. Tenderloin, always a choice meat, was usually fried for the workers. I suspect this was also a token reward for their hard work on a miserably cold day. Not to be wasteful, the lungs, referred to as the "lights," were also cooked and eaten fresh. Since refrigeration was not available, large portions of the pork had to be quickly salt-cured for preservation. My grandpa had built a salt box for my family years before, made like a rectangular table with four sides turned up. He intentionally made one of the legs shorter so the salt box sloped to one corner. This allowed any liquid to drain away from the meat as it cured. Over time, several layers of salt were rubbed into the pieces of pork, and a layer of cheesecloth was used to cover the meat to prevent flies from landing on it.

One year, while the hog carcasses were spread out on the ground for scraping, I was asked by Homer Thompson, a cousin and one of the butchers, whether or not I knew how to measure the true length of a pig's tail. Obviously, I had never given any thought to such, so Homer insisted on showing me the correct way. With my index finger extended, he tightly gripped my hand and proceeded to count finger lengths along the stretched out tail. As we neared the rear of the dead hog, he suddenly jammed my finger up its messy butt. Of course, everyone other than me got a big laugh out of the joke, but I was so mad that I stormed into the house and reported this abuse to my mother. She was sympathetic and assisted me in a thorough scrubbing of my hand but later admitted that she found humor in the prank also.

Time to Winterize Your Saluda Home

It's that time of year when you start thinking about winterizing your home so you don't have to worry about freezing pipes bursting or other damage to your house while you are gone. Here are a few key suggestions that you may want to make sure to do if your home is going to be empty for any amount of time.

Freeze Protection Safeguards

1. Locate your water main and shut it off.
2. Cut off electric service to hot water heater and drain tank.
3. Drain all pipes via interior faucets and exterior hose bibs, cover with freeze protectors.
4. Drain all garden hoses and store away for the winter.
5. Flush all toilets and add antifreeze to remaining water in tank and bowl.
6. Insure gutters are clean to allow for proper drainage during rain and snow.
7. Insure all condensate and drain lines from HVAC units are drained.
8. Insulate any exposed pipes that cannot be drained of water.

General Off-Season Protection

1. Shut off propane or natural gas at supply.
2. Turn off HVAC units at the electrical source unless a minimum temperature is to be maintained.
3. Prune tree limbs away from house to lessen possibility of storm damage.
4. Clean out your refrigerator, unplug and prop door open.
5. Unplug all other appliances, including TV's.
6. Store lawn furniture, grills, tools, etc.
7. Empty fuel from all gas powered equipment or add fuel additive.

8. Turn off home's electrical power at the main breaker unless specific breakers need to remain on for fire protection, security lighting and alarm systems.
9. Check exterior doors and windows for cracks and crevices and repair as needed
10. Inspect roof and flashings for potential leaks.
11. Close fireplace flues and dampers.
12. Test smoke detector batteries and replace as needed.
13. Shut off water to the house.
14. Do not leave valuables that may attract thieves in home.
15. Arrange for indoor plants to be watered if necessary.
16. Find someone who will drop by your home occasionally to make sure it is secure and that there are no problems. Be sure they know how to contact you.

Melanie's Family Recipe

Mammy's Oyster Dressing

1 1/2 pint oysters
 3 cup saltine crumbs
 2/3 cup melted butter
 1 1/2 cream
 1/2 cup oyster liquor
 4 Tbsp worcestershire
 salt and pepper

Drain oysters reserving liquor.
 Mix cracker crumbs, salt/pepper, and butter. Spread 1/3 of mixture into buttered baking dish. Cover with half of oysters another 1/3 layer of crumb mixture and the rest of the oysters. Top with final layer of crumbs. Warm oyster liquor, cream and Worcestershire sauce and pour of top of layered oyster mixture. Bake 350 30 minutes uncovered.
