
We need more Prayer Books and Humashim



Temple Emanu-El and Holy Name Catholic Church present Mark T. Sullivan, author of **Beneath a Scarlet Sky**. Based on the true story of a forgotten hero, **Beneath a Scarlet Sky** is the triumphant, epic tale of one young man's incredible courage and resilience during one of history's darkest hours.

Pino Lella wants nothing to do with the war or the Nazis, but when his family home in Milan is destroyed by Allied bombs, Pino joins an "underground railroad" helping Jews escape over the Alps. Through a series of unexpected twists, Pino joins the German army and ultimately becomes a spy for the Allies from inside German High Command.

Author Mark T. Sullivan will discuss his book and his interviews with the real life hero of the story at this interfaith event. Refreshments will follow the talk and discussion.

Temple Emanu-El, in co-operation with the Rhode Island State Council of Churches, will hold a series of conversations on the dynamics of race in our culture. Merciful Conversations on Race explores how white privilege functions in society and in religious communities, and the ways that it negatively impacts people of color. The course seeks to create a positive and trusting space to explore why race conversations can be a struggle, provide help for overcoming this challenge, and opportunities to further racial reconciliation on both personal and systemic levels.

These conversations will be based on a curriculum developed by the United Church of Christ, with materials adapted for conversations in a Jewish context. Rev. Betsy Aldrich Garland and Pastor Chontell Williams of the Rhode Island State Council of Churches, along with Rabbi Wayne Franklin, will guide the discussions.
