► Audience:

Applicants must be the administrator of a full-service jail. The jail administrator is defined as the person who directs the day-to-day operations/management of the jail. If space allows, teams composed of both the jail administrator and the classification chief will be considered for acceptance. Class size is limited to 28 participants. NIC will provide the training and materials at no cost to the participant.

► Course Description:

A properly implemented objective jail classification system can be expected to identify the level of risk presented by newly admitted inmates, based on the use of valid and reliable information. Appropriate housing and program assignments can then be made based on the inmate's potential risk to staff, other inmates, and him or herself. The goal of this class is to demonstrate how an objective jail classification system will provide jail administrators with an overview of assessing inmate risk and needs and the means to establishing a safe and secure housing plan.
