Teaching, Educating, and Mentoring (T.E.A.M.) School Liaison Program

The Michigan State Police, Grants and Community Services Division, Prevention Services and Secure Cities Section, will provide school liaison training for sworn officers and school security officers working with youth. T.E.A.M. training focuses primarily on a proactive effort to make schools and communities safer and on promoting responsible citizenship and positive character traits among students in grades K-12. Officers attending this training will also receive essential information regarding school violence, bullying, classroom management, public speaking, school and community relations and safety issues. The curriculum complements the Michigan Model for Health Curriculum utilized by all schools in the state of Michigan. The class is Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards approved. In 2010, the T.E.A.M. program won the National Criminal Justice Association, Midwest Region, Outstanding Criminal Justice Program Award.
