## Award Nomination Process

Anyone in the community can nominate a person for one of our eight award categories. All nominations must be submitted online by February 16, 2018. To submit a nomination, follow the quick and easy four step process outlined below.

### Steps to Nominate

- 1** To begin your nomination, visit:

# Lifetime of Giving

## Award Categories

### Outstanding Direct Support Professional

A person who directly assists individuals with developmental disabilities on a routine basis. These services include, but are not limited to, daily living skills, recreation, transportation, job coaching, home health support, and vocational services.

### Outstanding Self-Advocate

A person with a disability who effectively advocates for himself or herself.

### Outstanding Community Employer

A company/company representative that significantly contributes to providing inclusive, competitive employment opportunities for people with disabilities.

### Outstanding Community Partner

A business or organization whose sustained efforts have had a significant impact and/or enhanced the lives of people with disabilities. This business or organization has directly contributed to the success of individuals with developmental disabilities without reimbursement from DCBDD.

### Outstanding Advocate

A person who speaks and acts to enhance the lives of individuals with disabilities. An advocate uses his or her experiences to obtain and/or improve services.

### Outstanding Peer Mentor

A student, sibling or friend whose sustained efforts have had an impact and/or enhanced the lives of people with disabilities. Peer mentors provide education, recreation and support opportunities to individuals. The peer mentor may challenge the person with new ideas, and encourage him or her to move beyond the things that are most comfortable.

### Outstanding Professional

A professional (teacher, nurse, doctor, attorney, etc.) whose dedication, professionalism, and work in the community has significantly impacted and/or enhanced the lives of children and/or adults with disabilities by going above and beyond the responsibilities related to their specific profession.

### Outstanding Volunteer

A person who voluntarily promotes the goodness or improves the quality of life of people with developmental disabilities. Examples of outstanding volunteers could be Special Olympics coaches, Aktion Club volunteers, neighbors who go above and beyond to support someone with a disability, etc.
