Heidelberg Catechism, Questions 15-18

People: God's justice demands that human nature, which has sinned, must pay for sin; but a sinful human being could never pay for others.

Today's Worship Notes

Nicodemus was a Pharisee — and we all know how often, in the New Testament, the Pharisees are singled out for criticism, sometimes by Jesus himself. Much of their bad reputation, though, is undeserved. It's true that, as self-appointed guardians of Jewish tradition, they often found themselves in opposition to Jesus' reform movement, but they were not, by and large, in cahoots with the Roman occupiers, as the High Priest and his associates clearly were. The Pharisees preached a message of salvation through the Law, encouraging the people to find God through careful obedience. In his encounter with the Pharisee Nicodemus, we see Jesus honoring this religious leader for his faithful piety, even as he gently challenges him to go beyond the limits of the Law and find salvation through a conversion of the heart.
