# Governor-Elect Candidate



## Greg McDonald Candidate for Governor-Elect of the Carolinas District

Greg has been a member of the Kiwanis Club of Southport-Oak Island, NC since 2006. He has served as a volunteer, project manager, committee chair, board member, Club President and Lt. Governor for Division 26 of the Carolinas District. He is currently the District Formula Chair for the Carolinas District of Kiwanis International.

Greg has a vision for the Carolinas that starts with helping clubs become stronger and more effective in delivering relevant service to their communities. He believes that our clubs can grow to serve more youth, thrive by delivering more effective services in their communities, and prosper by providing an exceptional Kiwanis experience to their members. He believes that the District can facilitate this vision by providing every club access to high-quality, low-cost training; targeted assistance when needed; and an empathetic voice on issues of importance to our members.

Greg believes in Kiwanis and the kids that we serve.

During Greg's service in Kiwanis he has planned and led many of his Club's major fundraising events, volunteered his time to assist in pre-school and elementary school reading programs, tutored at-risk students, taught leadership and life skills, judged senior projects for the high schools, proctored student achievement exams, and chaired the Scholarship Committee. As President of the Southport-Oak Island Club he was instrumental in increasing his own club's membership; chartering a new Circle K Club at Brunswick Community College; and establishing, chartering, and supporting a new Kiwanis Club in the North Brunswick community of Leland.

Greg is a Distinguished Past-President, a Walter Zeller Fellow, and the recipient of a 2013-2014 International President's Citation for Outstanding Leadership as Lt. Governor.

Greg's commitment to public and community service is life-long. He is an Eagle Scout and has worked with youth as a leader with the Boy Scouts, the YMCA, and the Civil Air Patrol. He served for 11 years in the U.S. Air Force and the Air Force Reserve as a Pararescueman and has been decorated for both combat and non-combat heroism while saving lives of those injured and in peril. He spent more than 25 years working for the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO), the investigative agency of the Congress, retiring as a Senior Executive in 2003. Since retiring from GAO, Greg taught for 5 years as an adjunct faculty member at Brunswick Community College. He is now consulting part time with public agencies and non-profit organizations to help improve their management and operations.

Greg has a long history of work with non-profit organizations as a project manager, board member, and officer. As Executive Director of the National Association for Search and Rescue for more than 8 years he helped bring the organization into national prominence, increased its membership by more than 500 percent and helped establish national and international disaster response teams that have been instrumental in saving lives worldwide for almost 2 decades.

Greg has B.S. and M.P.A. degrees from Portland State University. He has completed the program on Managing the Information Services Resource at the Harvard University Graduate School of Business and the program on Leadership and Performance for Senior Executives at Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government. He is the recipient of GAO's Distinguished Service and Meritorious Service Awards. He was a 1978-1980 Presidential Management Intern.

Greg is married to Margaret (Peggy) McDonald, who is also a Kiwanian and a Past-President of the Southport-Oak Island Club. They have three grown sons and four grandchildren.
