
**New Sermon Series:** We have just begun our new series of messages through the **Gospel of John**. What an exciting way to begin the new year! Having finished the prologue of John (1:1-18) on Christmas Eve and a special message on "Who We Are And What We're About As A Church" on New Year's Eve from John 1:19-34, we are ready this first Sunday of the new year to dive right into the meat of the Fourth Gospel.

### **Up Coming :**

In January the preschoolers will be learning about "The Bible being true" We will be focusing on Josiah and the lost scroll, Daniel chooses to obey, Daniel in the lion's den and Jonah.

### **Start the New Year off right:**

Here are some ideas to help your Preschooler grow closer in Christ.

Buy your child/children their own Bible. Encourage them to take it with them to Sunday school. Read the Sunday school Bible story from their own Bible at bed time.

1. **Read Bible story books, watch Bible story movies and play Christian music.** All of this will help show the importance of God's word and the way He wants us to live.
2. **Be intentional about relating what is happening in the life of your family to what you have read or listened to from God's word.**
3. **Keep a family journal of prayer requests and the answers that follow.** Talk about how God provides and blesses your family.
4. **Memorize short scriptures or Bible phrases.** Put the words to a simple song or add hand motions to the scripture as a way to help your child remember the words. Practice saying or singing them in the car together. Song suggestions: "The Farmer in the Dell", "Mary Had a Little Lamb", or "Twinkle, Twinkle".
5. **At bed time, make it a routine to pray and Thank God for what He has done.** Children are naturally good at thinking of things to be Thankful for. Use this time to talk about the good things that have happened during the day.

Happy New Year from England!

With the Christmas season God opened up opportunities for ministry for us in different areas. Sheila was able to help a local Christian charity three days a week sorting toys. These toys were delivered to needy families who would not have Christmas gifts otherwise. Each package has information and tracts telling about the meaning of Christmas.

There were a number of toy donations that were not new, but we were able to give them to churches and charities who work with refugees. Our dining room has been overflowing with plastic bags full of games, toys and stuffed animals. Sometimes when we were eating, noises would come out of the bags. We have been able to distribute presents to over 250 refugee children.

Thank you for your prayers as Terry was able to be in high schools throughout December and lead 15 minute assemblies on Christmas at the various schools. Because of British Law and no separation of church and state, Terry was able to explain the reason Jesus came was to bring light and to overcome the darkness that is in everyone's lives and in the world (sin). Jesus died and rose, conquering death to bring us into a right relationship with God. (Just a short summary of what he said.) In total Terry spoke to 1,467 students and teachers. Please continue to pray that the truth of the gospel will become clear for the students and teachers.
