

September Greetings,



August proved to be a great month for our church. We had **21 people making decisions to join the church**, about half of which came by baptism. Yes, the baptismal waters have been stirring for a number of weeks now as people have come Sunday by Sunday to confess faith in Jesus. We will be baptizing once again this Lord's Day as we kick off the month of September together. It is a blessing to see such a wide range of people joining our church and being baptized. We've had children, youth, college students, adults with children, and retired people all coming and feeling led to join the Grover family of God. We will also be observing the Lord's Supper coming up on September 17th in both services. I wish we could always do baptism in both services. We have tried to schedule them in such a way that both services get to witness some of the baptisms as they occur. The second service, however, seems to be the time that most people wish to be baptized. Our gathering of worshipers also grew in August over July as we averaged 433 for the month. It is always good to have our college students back from their summer break, and it was a blessing to have them all in our home Monday evening for supper and Bible Study.



Speaking of new members, we will be having a new **Exploring Membership Class** for all of our new members and those thinking about membership on September 17th at noon in the Family Life Center right after the second service at noon with a free lunch from Jimmy John's. The lunch and class are inter-woven together to save time, so we are generally finished up by 1:30 p.m. If you have never attended one of these classes, come join us as we introduce our staff, some of our deacons, and share with you some wonderful things about our church.

Book of Revelation Update: We are going to be picking up the pace a little bit as we move toward the final stretch in Revelation. Pastor Brent will be finishing up chapters 13-14 the next two Sundays which will conclude this particular section of the book. On September 17th, I will be leading us in the observance of the Lord's Supper sharing highlights from Revelation Chapter Fifteen before we finish the final chapters of the tribulation.





Our Annual **Women's Retreat** is coming up in just one week on September 8-10th. This year the study will be from the Book of Hosea. ANNOUNCEMENT: Fall is on its way with a few cooler temperatures and the beginning of school schedules. Fall also means it's time for another "season" of the GPBC Christmas Chorale! I want to encourage anyone who likes to sing in a choir setting or be involved in an outreach production (community members from other churches included), to reserve 5-6pm on Sunday afternoons beginning on Sept 10. The choir will rehearse each week in preparation for our annual mission/outreach program to be presented on December 2nd and 3rd. The music and drama tools have been selected, but they are only tools. The real magic of this presentation lies in the hearts using them. The impact is always at least two-fold. It impacts those who view the presentation, and also impacts the presenters themselves. Please consider impacting our community and your own life by serving in this capacity.

Will this month's edition of Noteworthy spark any introspection, comments or conversations from the readership? The following comments have been presented before, but with a growing church, I feel that these comments need to be repeated. I want each of us to really think about what worship is and why and how we do it. Do you feel engaged by the prompters (Worship Team), as a performer (congregation), for the audience of one (God)??!

As a Worship Pastor, I have to make certain decisions that directly affect how many worshipers end up being engaged. Just one of those decisions deals with physical movement and involvement. I'm sometimes asked, "do I have to clap and/or raise my hands, or move, or close my eyes to 'prove' I'm engaged in worship?" This question can open up a lengthy and emotional debate ... OR ... it can be answered in the following manner: "Only God's opinion and perspective matters on this subject. He and only He can tell if you're engaged in worship, and He does so beginning from the inside out".

Don't hear what I'm not saying with that response!! Whether you're outwardly demonstrative or not, you could or could not be worshipping. Being engaged in worship means you're responding to God's presence in your life with praise, thanksgiving, and obedience. This effort can take on MANY different faces. Some enjoy and most often show their engaged worship in total stillness and silence with their eyes closed while others enjoy shouting at the "top of their lungs", clapping, and moving while yet others cannot feel totally submissive until they are prostrate before their Lord. Some even do all of the above at different times depending upon their current circumstances.

If engaged worship can look very different, then, "How do you combine everyone's preferences/modes of communication/personalities into one offering of praise?" I recommend that you ALLOW God to work in and through the Worship Team and the congregation's hearts to prompt appropriate, obedient responses. We may never all be doing the same thing on the outside at the same time, but we could all be engaged and worshipping at the same time... in truth and in spirit!!

You might now ask, "How can I be an engaged worshipper when a person or people near me are worshipping in a manner different than I prefer or that distracts me?" Again, I recommend that you ALLOW God to help you focus on Him rather than on others. Have God help you recognize your individual preferences/modes of communication/personality and understand that they can help or hinder corporate worship. We must all be aware of the consequences of our own actions (or non-actions) in this setting. I

would hate for my actions in corporate worship to cause a distraction or hinder another brother or sister from worshipping.

Can we focus upward and inward so that what comes out will be appropriate?..... *Even if* someone next to us is worshiping differently than we do or prefer? *Even if* we're not singing one of our favorite songs or style of song? *Even if* the room's lights are too bright or too dark for us? *Even if* the temperature of the room is not to our liking? OF COURSE, but we have to DO IT!!

My prayer this month is that you FIRST seek and find God in worship and then strive to be obedient to His urgings for how best to respond to his presence in your life. I continue to say, after He does work IN us (through His presence in your heart during worship), He can work THROUGH us (to respond appropriately in worship) so that we can fulfill the GPBC mission statement, "To Know Christ and To Make Him Known".

Who is the most meaningful person in your life? Take a moment and think about them. In the small space below, I want you to write down the attributes or qualities of that person that you most appreciate.




Fall 2017 Life University


"Jonah: A Journey in a Prophet's Shoes" led by Roger Dumas in Edu Room 101

Jonah is a small four-chapter book in the Old Testament that most Christians have been familiar with since they were children. Even though the book is short, it is one of those most dynamic books for application in our culture today. Regardless of your age, come and join this rich study as we examine incredible background information to better understand the depravity of the people of Nineveh, the sovereignty of the God who works through His spoken Word to a broken world, the mindset that drove Jonah to run away from God's plans for his life, the emotions that can come from ministering in such a broken world, and the prophetic fulfillment that Jesus Himself quotes in Matthew 12:40, "For just as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." Just bring your Bible, a pen and a notebook and let's have some fun!



"The Money Challenge" led by Dennis Docheff in Edu Room 104

This small, but unbelievably helpful and Biblically based material written by Dr. Art Rainer is tremendous! This class can't be recommended highly enough regardless of your age or financial situation. The more faithful and wise we can be with the finances that God has entrusted to us the more satisfied we will be as managers of God's blessings. God did not design us to be hoarders, but a conduit through which His generosity flows. In this class, we will touch on a Biblical understanding of finances, principles and the order of operations for saving, budgeting, practical goal setting, real life examples, and together combating the real-life generosity killers that each of us face. 


