July has been an extraordinary month as we averaged right at 420 worshippers every Sunday and had three join the church and one for baptism. 
Special Called Business Meeting: Speaking of Wednesday nights, there will be a special called business



meeting on Wednesday night, August 9th, at 6:30 p.m. in the Worship Center following the Wednesday night supper. The purpose of the meeting is to vote on a proposal from the Bus Committee to purchase a new 25 passenger Ford E-450/Impulse 2017 bus. The recommendation comes after the discovery that our present bus has been declared unsafe and not cost effective to repair. The new bus is a little bit larger than our previous bus in that it contains a rear luggage compartment and is a heavier duty

and a higher grade of vehicle. It will come with rear backup camera and lettering with our name and logo. In consultation with the Finance Committee and the Board of Directors, the new bus will be purchased from Master’s Transportation in Belton, MO for a cost of \$69,900.00 and will be paid for in cash out of the general fund and budget of the church. We plan to have the bus here the night of August 9th for everyone to see, and possibly the Sunday prior to that.

Men’s Ministry/Biblical Manhood Conference will be on August 19th this summer for which our men will be going to Frederick Boulevard Baptist Church in St Joseph, Missouri, to attend a conference entitled: “Our High Calling: Biblical Manhood in the Home, Church, and World.” The cost is only \$15.00 per person with lunch provided. The 10:30am Worship Service on the 16th this past month clearly began with a different energy than usual. VBS children opened the service with one of their songs and the energy they injected into the sanctuary was evident. Special thanks to Kathie Appleton, Teresa Collins and the entire VBS staff for their hard work and teaching. They came to share their joy for the Lord with us and ended up teaching at the same time!! They had some of the same attributes I mentioned last month that the Prime Time Singers do. The parallels are amazing. They had free body language, genuine authentic facial expressions, singing exuberance and intuitive tenderness just like the veterans. This is a great goal for us to strive for together each and every service.

The parallel attributes of the children and senior adults can be very stimulating for our worship. On the other hand, recent divisive events in our country and negative situations in our own lives can leave us wondering “why (God)?” and hinder our worship too easily. I would like to share some verses and research that have been stimulating and also encouraging to me in trying to make some kind of sense out of (what we might consider) weird, crazy, unjustified, unthinkable, or just plain unpleasant things that happen to us or around us.

We can be encouraged when reading enough material around these particular verses to gain a contextual understanding of their meaning. I would also encourage you to pray before, during, and/or after reading, that the Holy Spirit guides you in your interpretations. These suggestions help us apply the biblical truths appropriately to your lives.

Below are some verses to read, reread, and/or use as daily devotionals. Allow yourself to meditate on their words.

“And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.” - Romans 8:28 (NIV)

“Praise God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is so good, and by raising Jesus from death, he has given us new life and a hope that lives on. God has something stored up for you in heaven, where it will never decay or be ruined or disappear. You have faith in God whose power will protect you until the last day. Then he will save you, just as he has always planned to do. On that day you will be glad, even if you have to go through many hard trials for a while. Your faith will be like gold that has been tested in a fire. And these trials will prove that your faith is worth much more than gold that can be destroyed. They will show that you will be given praise and honor and glory when Jesus Christ returns. (Word in Life Bible.” - 1 Peter 1:3-7 (Contemporary English Version)

*“In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the **plan** of him who works out every-*

thing in conformity with the purpose of his will.” - Ephesians 1:11 (NIV)

“This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us.” - 1 John 5:14 (NIV)

*“In their hearts human beings **plan** their course, but the LORD establishes their steps.” - Proverbs 19:9 (NIV)*

*“All this also comes from the LORD Almighty, whose **plan** is wonderful, whose wisdom is magnificent.” - Isaiah 28:29 (NIV)*

My hope is that services in the future can reach towards the goal of employing the youth/senior adult parallel attributes in a strong way. Choose this Day...

Joshua 24:15, or at least a small portion of Joshua 24:15 is often quoted and placed upon magnets, t-shirts, house signs, and anything else a Christian business can think to put it on. I do want to take a moment, to look at the full verse, *“And if it is evil in your eyes to serve the LORD, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your fathers served in the region beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD.”* The underline portion is what makes the sign. So why am I pointing this out? Do we have a sudden explosion of Amorite false god worship? Of course not, but we have a text before us that depicts the costly intentionality that a follower of God must have if they are truly desiring a closeness to Yahweh. The implications are that if your first and greatest priority for your own life and therein those under your care is not holiness then it isn't going to happen by accident.

I want you to think very honestly about two serious questions. First, “Gauging by my calendar, excitement level and finances, what is the highest priority for my life?” Second if you do have kids or grandkids, “Gauging by my calendar, excitement level and finances, what is my highest concern for them?” There are many things a person can want most for their life or that a parent/grandparent may want for their child/grandchild when they become adults. Only one of these three, however, can be first at any given time as the highest priority in a person or parent's motivation: **Happiness, Success, or Holiness.**

If you for your own life or a parent subconsciously prioritizes their child's perceived **happiness** they will allow them to stop coming to church when the child no longer wants to. (5th to 6th grade transition, 8th-9th grade transition, turn sixteen and their social freedoms expand, senior year transition, begin dating, have relational conflict with someone else in the youth group, or generally hear their child use the ‘B’ Word – Boring). The same applies to your own life. If you believe happiness is your ultimate goal for church, when things become boring or you long for past days, your commitment to gather with the saints will evaporate. Choose this day...

If you for your own life or a parent subconsciously prioritizes their child's **success**, they will allow them to stop coming to church when the child does other things they are good at or that the parent perceives will make them a more successful adult (team sports, extra time studying and doing ‘homework’, getting a job), the child sees that you get more excited about their ‘successes’ than their faith commitment & they more often than not will live accordingly once they graduate high school. What do your kids/grandkids see you getting excited about? When you go on vacation do you take a vacation from church or do you find a local church to worship with. Choose this day...

Here's the point. You will never accidentally ‘Choose this day’ to prioritize holiness for your life or those under your authority. A parent will NEVER subconsciously prioritize their child's **holiness**. A parent must intentionally schedule around activities and routines built for their child's spiritual disciplines and standards. Holiness will cause you and your child to sacrifice. Period. It's not legalism, it's a choosing this day whom you will serve. On your calendar, with your finances, and with your energy prioritize holiness at the cost of perceived success and happiness. Make corporate worship, Sunday School, and serving in a ministry a greater priority this month in your hearts as well as on your calendars.

V.B.S. this year raised an amazing amount of money to purchase rice and beans for the students at Grace Christian School. The amount raised will provide funds to pay for 10 months. Praise GOD for his provisions.

The students receive one meal per day, for many this may be the only food they eat in a 24 hour day. Pastor Wisny has ladies that cook the meal in a makeshift tin shed. These meals are prepared year round ensuring the children get some nutrition daily. The ladies that do the cooking receive little if any pay for their labors. The food is purchased in Port au Prince and transported to Mare Rouge, where Pastor Wisny keeps it in a locked room at the school. We would love to be able to pay these ladies that cook a few dollars a month for their labors, perhaps twenty dollars per month.



Grace Christian School will start the first week of September. This year the enrollment is at 255 students. We must remember that the opportunity for these children to get an education is a huge gift to them and their families. The enrollment is up from 191 last year to 255, meaning 64 children will need uniforms, books and school supplies. When we are in Port au Prince most of needs are purchased there and transported to Mare Rouge. The fabric for the uniforms is also purchased in Port au Prince and then the ladies or gentlemen in Mare Rouge make the uniforms. This gives those that sew an income for a short time.

You will remember that Monica Fox raised money to complete the additional four rooms needed to improve the school. Monica, working as a servant to our Father to grow the Kingdom as she raised 3/4th of the amount needed to put a roof on the new rooms. We are praying that God will supply the remainder and the rooms will be ready for use by October.

We will keep you all updated as the progress continues.



We are planning a Mission trip to Mare Rouge in October if you are interested, please contact me.

Terry and Sheila Wilbanks and girls will be going back home to England during the month of August. We need to be in prayer for them as they continue their ministries and for the girls in school.




