Servanthood. I have chosen servanthood as the focus for this month's Noteworthy because I feel so richly blessed to be around so many at GPBC that serve appropriately and mightily with their spiritual gifts, hearts, abilities, personalities, and experiences (S.H.A.P.E.). As we continue to grow as a church, I would like for everyone to reflect on some of Rick Warren's thoughts on this subject from his book, "The Purpose Driven Life: What on Earth Am I here For?". He does a beautiful job of explaining this subject in much greater detail than space allows for me to reiterate. He uses days 29-35 (out of 40) to help us understand this subject. The brief summary points, verses and questions below were taken from the end of each of the six chapters (days) dedicated to servanthood.



1. **Points to Ponder:** *Service is not optional. I was shaped for serving God. Nobody else can be me. God deserves my best. I serve God by serving others. To be a servant I must think like a servant. God works best when I admit my weakness.*
2. **Verses to remember:**
 "for we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."
Ephesians 2:10
 "God works through different men in different ways, but it is the same God who achieves his purposes through them all."
1 Corinthians 12:6
 "God has given each of you some special abilities; be sure to use them to help each other, passing on to others God's many kinds of blessings." *1 Peter 4:10*
 "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth." *2 Timothy 2:15*
 "If you give even a cup of cold water to one of the least of my followers, you will surely be rewarded." *Matthew 10:42*
 "Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus." *Philippians 2:5*
 "My grace is sufficient for you, my power is made perfect in weakness." *2 Corinthians 12:9a*
3. **Questions to Consider:** *What is holding me back from accepting God's call to serve him? In what way can I see myself passionately serving others and loving it? What God-given ability or personal experience can I offer to my church? How can I make the best use of what God has given me? Which of the six characteristics of real servants offers the greatest challenge to me? Am I usually more concerned about being served or finding ways to serve others? Am I limiting God's power in my life by trying to hide my weaknesses? What do I need to be honest about in order to help others?*

I hope the items I've shared from Rick above will motivate you to grab a copy of his book and read his thoughts in much greater detail...or grab the copy you already have and have already read in 2002 and read it again as I did! I believe he makes all of his points with excellent, common sense illustrations and could help you tweak your servanthood and/or attitude about the same.

I LOVE how so many at GPBC demonstrate how Rick describes servanthood!!

Intergenerational Church

One of the sweetest joys of serving Grover Park Baptist Church is our commitment to becoming an intergenerational church. I want to take this article to share why I believe this is important and what you specifically can do to continue to make this a greater reality for our church family.

Biblically, the individual is swallowed up within the greater identity of the body of Christ. Much of the conflict that is addressed in the Corinthian letters and in the book of James is due to the immaturity of individuals prioritizing their own preferences or 'gifts'. The local church is bigger than my preferences. Many churches tend to unintentionally shed one or multiple generations by shifting their entire vision toward one particular generation. Every church must decide what music, practices, ministries, budgets, and calendaring it will prioritize. Let me be clear, every person has an instinct to want to fight for their own personal preferences. In the local church, this should not be so! As believers we ought to be laying down our preferences for the sake of others. The more spiritually mature believers ought to take the initiative to surrender their preferences for the edifying of the other believers. Prioritizing unity in the Gospel over pickiness. What does this look like?

When we sing a song in a worship service and it isn't to your ideal beat, instead of thinking, "I don't like that beat/song." Think, "Praise God I am a part of a church family that is bigger than my preferences." In regard to ministries, instead of thinking "My ministry needs more resources and attention." Think, "How can the ministry I am leading be a greater blessing on other ministries and the life of the church?" When you look around before or after a worship service and see people of other generations, instead of thinking, "There isn't a lot of people here in my generation." Think, "Thank God they are here, and I am going to go introduce myself to them and build a friendship." Instead of thinking, "That person probably wouldn't like my Sunday School class." Think, "I'm not going to say 'no' for them, I am going to invite them to join me in my Sunday School class."

A healthy marriage will only be truly healthy when both the husband and wife focus on the Gospel and ask the question, "How can I bless my spouse right now?" When both parties are consumed by this question then servant behavior creates something beautiful that reflects Jesus Christ and His Church. This should be our desire as a local church. Our aim must be to bless one another through love and good deeds as we partner together to known Christ and make Him known. May Grover Park always be a congregation that rests under the authority of the Bible and willingly lays down her preferences to be an intergenerational family. I am so proud to be a part of such an intergenerational body.







Preschool Newsletter

RESURRECTION ROLLS

(Each ingredient represents something used to prepare Christ's body for burial.)

- Large marshmallows
- A mixture of
 - * Melted butter (less than 1/2 stick)
 - & cinnamon/sugar (yum!)
- A can of refrigerated crescent rolls (makes 8)

First separate crescents into triangles. (This represents the linen used for covering the dead.) Dip and roll one marshmallow (representing Christ's body) into melted butter. (butter represents the oils used in anointing the dead body) Then roll the marshmallow in the cinnamon/sugar mixture (the mixture represents the spices used to prepare the body for burial) Place the marshmallow in the center of one crescent triangle (marshmallow represents Jesus). Fold the crescent around the marshmallow and pinch the edges tightly together, leaving no openings (**very important**).

Place the crescent-wrapped marshmallows on a slightly-greased cookie sheet.

Place the tray in the oven (which represents the tomb) and bake according to the package directions. Close the "tomb" tightly and wait.....when it's time, open the "tomb"....the marshmallow has disappeared!

The marshmallow melts while cooking, leaving only the puffed crescent roll.

This represents how Christ rose from the dead.

You can use this recipe to share about Jesus' Miracle and why we celebrate Easter.

*On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? **He is not here; he has risen!** Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' " Then they remembered his words. - Luke 24:1-8*
