

Is it time for you to revisit some thought provoking philosophical statements about congregational singing?? The following words from Worship Leader magazine were written for Worship Leaders', but I thought they were universal enough to share with you again. I invite you to meditate on them as I have.



1. *Singing is just one of the many ways the congregation can participate in worship; however, it may be the most impacting. Rick Warren says, "As a pastor, I hate to admit this, but people don't remember sermons or speeches – they don't even remember paragraphs. What people remember are simple statements, slogans, and phrases". Simple statements, slogans, and phrases are hallmarks of great songs. Other great speakers concur. Speaking of congregational singing, C.H. Surgeon said: "Personal praise is sweet unto God, but congregational praise has a multiplicity of sweetenesses in it!" Martin Luther said, "Next to theology, I give the first and highest honor to music."*
2. *Congregational singing that honors God, honors Scripture. Methods come and go but the message of God never changes. As the crowd engages in singing, the songs of the church will become an indelible part of their lives.*
3. *We (Worship Leaders) put prayers on the lips of people corporately on Sunday that have the power to become their prayers individually on Monday through Saturday.*
4. *Any way we tell it, the goal is that in worship our people find their raw and real individual stories swallowed up in God's great Story. The result of this is nothing short of miraculous in the lives of our people.*
5. *As a result of being in worship, all our brothers and sisters are renewed in their weekly walk of communing with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Worship doesn't so much help us escape from reality. It helps us make sense of it. This renewed communion with God leads to a restored communion with others – the pastoral end game of our worship planning and leading. It is the fruit of being faithful "readers," at once committed to the individual stories of our people and the earth-altering Story of the God-man nailed to a tree for the sins of the world.*

If we truly adore someone we will desire to know them better. Sports, hobbies, movies, dating, you name it. If we adore someone or something, we will desire to know them or it much better. Last semester we spent our time on Wednesday nights studying and understanding the attributes of God. As we gained a deeper knowledge of who God is, we marveled at his fullness and were reminded at how great his power, presence, holiness, wrath, justice, grace, mercy, kindness, beauty, will, knowledge, and purpose truly are. We took this understanding of God and on a weekly basis asked our students to consider two questions, “Now that I know this about God, how must this impact my relationships with my family, friends, fellowship with my local church, and people who are far from God?” and second, “Now that I know this about God, how must this impact my responsibilities over my time, talent, treasures, and technology?”

This semester we will continue to grow in our knowledge of God because He has sufficiently made Himself known to us in the Bible. In each lesson, we will be training up and empower a middle school or high school student to teach a portion of the lesson to the rest of the students. We want to develop leaders who want to and know how to make disciples. We will spend the next 13 weeks on the Trinity.




