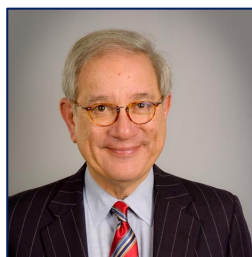

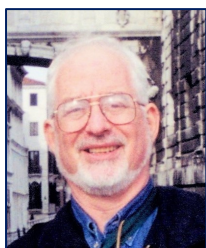

Barry Cantor and his wife Natalie joined Ohr Kodesh in 1997. One of the first efforts Barry undertook was developing and organizing a *Chavurah* program for Ohr Kodesh to create small affinity groups organized around Jewish interests, meeting in individual homes, to strengthen connections between members and promote multi-generational friendship groups. One of the most successful *Chavurah* groups created was the Ohr Kodesh Book Club which Barry has led from inception until today. As a result of the early *Chavurah* organizing, Barry was also invited to join the Ohr Kodesh Board of Directors for two years (1999-2000) where he served as the OKC liaison to the Jewish Primary Day School (JPDS) and served as a voting member on their board as well.



Marla Satinsky has made Ohr Kodesh her home for the past 10 years since she, her husband Andrew, and her sons Evan (21) and Milo (18) returned from living in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. She grew up in New York and New Jersey, where her parents were very involved in synagogue life. Marla has a BS in nursing from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst and worked as a critical care nurse for many years. She took a break to learn the art of floral design and started Shayna Blooms, her small event business. Marla has recently returned to nursing and is working for JSSA as a hospice intake nurse.

Marla served on the Ohr Kodesh board from 2008-2012, was also co-chair of our Membership Committee. In this role, Marla spearheaded the "New Member Home-Hosted Shabbat Dinner" program, whereby existing OKC families host catered Shabbat dinners in their homes for new members. She also helped initiate several programs which have become staples on the annual Ohr Kodesh calendar such as Movie Night, brunches for prospective members, and membership-sponsored *kiddushim*.

Marla regularly attends Shabbat services and is always looking for unfamiliar faces to greet at the *kiddush*. She frequently makes meals for new Moms and members recovering from surgery or illness. She has been a steady member of the Hadassah evening book group and served on its *Simcha* board for several years.

Hiddur mitzvah, the beautification of a *mitzvah*, is an important element of Marla's Judaic practice, and this can be seen through the floral designs she periodically creates for the *bimah* and Social Hall for Shabbat and holidays. She looks forward to continuing her involvement on the Membership Committee and Ohr Kodesh generally for many more years.



Carol Soble and her husband, Michael Shibley, have been affiliated with Ohr Kodesh since the late 1980s, starting with their children Daniel and Beth's enrollment in the ECC and continuing with their studies in what is now our Alvin Browdy Religious School. With their children's school enrollment came a request to join the religious school board and Carol's decision to attend Rabbi Fishman's weekly classes. When the rabbi invited Carol to join the *Chesed* Committee, Carol realized that she couldn't say no to the rabbi, and she later served as co-chair. Carol continues to participate on the *Chesed* committee, is once again on the religious school board, has served on the *shul* board, assisted in the Salzberg Family Library, has recruited Michael to create artwork for various *shul* materials and functions, and has been part of the assembly line that packs holiday gift boxes for college students. Carol is also a member of the group of women who distribute electric Shabbat

candles at Suburban Hospital. Carol and Michael continued their involvement in the Lone Soldier Center in Jerusalem following their son's IDF service.

Carol works at home as a freelance editor. Carol and Michael's son, Rabbi Daniel Shibley, works and attends university in Jerusalem and Tel Aviv, and their daughter, Beth Shibley, lives in Frederick and will be married in November. Both children became *bar/bat mitzvah* at Ohr Kodesh. When Carol's car isn't parked in front of her house, it's usually parked in front of Ohr Kodesh (on our side of the street).
