

**University of Chicago Mini-Residency with Dr. Sherer**  
Co-Sponsored by the Midwest AIDS Training and Education Center (MATEC)



The Mini-residency is a two and a half day intensive HIV educational experience. Lectures on a variety of HIV related topics are interspersed with case study and clinical encounters with patients where the lecture information can be immediately applied to real-time patient situations. This program is moderated by Dr. Renslow Sherer. Dr. Sherer has been at the forefront of developing programs to treat HIV in Chicago, the development of the DHHS treatment guidelines and currently is a clinical associate at University of Chicago's Section of Infectious Diseases. Participants will have lectures from Dr. Sherer and his colleagues at the University of Chicago, Section of Infectious Diseases. Participants will also have opportunity to discuss questions and cases with Dr. Sherer and his colleagues.
