

FUMC is partnering with St. James Episcopal Church to stuff Thanksgiving Baskets for Neighbors in Need on Saturday, November 17<sup>th</sup> at St. James Church. There will be two shifts this year that need volunteer assistance. The first shift starts at 7:15 a.m. which entails unloading donated food from the trucks and

stuffing the bags. The other shift begins at 8:30 when the community members arrive and need help loading vehicles with their bags of food. Typically, volunteer assistance is needed up until 11:00 AM that morning. Additionally, youth can earn service learning hours and stay as long as possible to help fill the bags, load cars and share God's blessings. A donation of \$32.00 will provide a complete turkey and fixings dinner for a family of four. Last year FUMC and St. James partnered to provide over 100 bags of food thanks to everyone's generosity. Donations for Thanksgiving dinners can be made in cash or check (payable to FUMC) and placed in the small shoe box in the Narthex marked for this effort. ### **GIVING TUESDAY INITIATIVE**

Mark your calendars for #GivingTuesday, November 27, 2018. United Methodists will extend the spirit of giving thanks into the Advent season as they #GiveUMC to advance ministry in our community and around the world. Last year on #GivingTuesday, United Methodists collectively raised more than \$677,000 online for projects and missionaries.

This year, FUMC's Missions Team is will augment donations you make from now through December 3 to The Advance and select local nonprofits. Missions has set aside up to \$5,000 for this giving initiative and challenges all of you get involved in Giving Tuesday. Give a gift and Missions Committee will give one too!

## Step 1: Decide whether you want to give to The Advance or a local nonprofit.

What is The Advance? The Advance is an official program of The United Methodist Church for voluntary, designated, second-mile giving. Through The Advance, individuals and families may choose to support mission programs or mission personnel with their financial gifts. Each Advance project has been vetted and approved by Global Ministries and Advance staff. The Advance allocates 100% of all giving to the designated project or missionary.

### Step 2: Make your donation.

To give through The Advance, view the projects online at <a href="https://www.umcmission.org/Giving-Tuesday">https://www.umcmission.org/Giving-Tuesday</a> and make your donation. If you're unsure about how to navigate the website, FUMC Youth will have laptops and be available to assist you after worship on Nov. 25 and Dec. 3.

To give to a local nonprofit, make a check payable to FUMC, write the name of the nonprofit on the memo line, and place it in the offering plate or mail it to the church. FUMC will direct 100% of gifts to the designated nonprofits.

# Step 3: Tell us about your donation. This information will help us get an idea of what kinds of Missions our congregation supports.

If you're giving through The Advance, there is a place to enter our church name, city, and state. Please fill in those details. After you've made your donation, please forward your receipt to <a href="mailto:Missions@FriendshipMethodist.org">Missions@FriendshipMethodist.org</a> so that we're aware of your gift.

If you're giving to local nonprofits, you can skip this step. Because you're writing a check to FUMC, we'll have the necessary details about your gift.
