## Advent Book and Bible Study

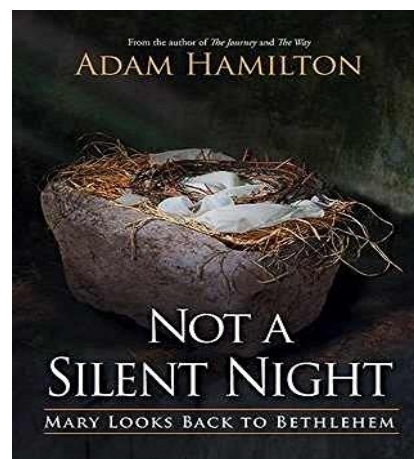
Thursdays – November 10, 17
