

Local patient represented Shriners Hospital at PGA TOUR tournament in Las Vegas

Lily Silverstein, 17, a patient at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Lexington from Paducah, Kentucky, had the experience of a lifetime in November when she represents the local hospital at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, an official PGA TOUR event in Las Vegas, November 5–6.

Lily was chosen as one of 22 patient ambassadors throughout the country to represent the hospital network at the tournament, where she will serve as a standard bearer on the weekend, carrying the scores of a group of professional golfers as they compete in the tournament. This is a rare "behind the ropes" opportunity at the PGA TOUR event, as well as a chance to share how Shriners Hospitals has helped transform her life.

Lily has worn a prosthetic leg since she was 10 months old and has been through five surgeries to straighten her residual limb. As a child,

she played soccer, danced, and completed two triathlons. Now her favorite activities are playing piano, which she has done for 12 years, singing in the Paducah Symphony Youth Chorus, tutoring math, and leading her Generation Joshua Civics Club.

As part of her participation in the tournament, Lily's story and photo will appear in the tournament program and her information will be shared with the Golf Channel, which will televise the tournament nationally. The broadcast reaches over 700 million homes across 240 countries worldwide. "The purpose of the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open is to not only bring PGA TOUR golf to Las Vegas, but more importantly, to bring awareness to the great work of Shriners Hospitals for Children and the work those hospitals do to help transform the lives of children with orthopaedic conditions, burns, cleft lip and palate and spinal cord injuries," said Adam Sperling, executive director of the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open. "We thought that bringing more of the hospital's patients to the tournament and giving them an opportunity to experience some of the best golfers in the world would be a great way to increase the involvement of the hospitals and the patients in this event."




