






News from Cincinnati

Giving the gift of a smile

That is exactly what David Beck, D.D.S. is doing. He has been volunteering his services and time to help patients at Shriners Hospitals for Children®—Cincinnati since 2012.

Dr. Beck learned about Cincinnati Shriners Hospital through one of his patients, Pam Kresser. She is an RN that works in Family Services at the hospital. "She knew we volunteered to help treat veterans and asked if I could help some of the children since there is no dentist on staff." said Dr. Beck.

Once he found out about the conditions treated at Cincinnati Shriners Hospital he jumped at the chance to help. There are many complex craniofacial patients in need of dental services. He knew his knowledge, time and talent could help many of Shriners patients that may not have the opportunity to receive dental care.

"I'm so amazed at the care patients and families receive at Cincinnati Shriners Hospital," said Dr. Beck. "I had no idea all of the plastic surgery conditions they treat regardless of a families ability to pay."

Dr. Beck has treated more than 30 of Shriners' patients and continues to do

so. He treats them at his office in downtown Cincinnati and at the hospital. He also consults with their pediatric plastic surgeons on complicated craniofacial patients and burn survivors. Some of the procedures he performs include extractions, root canals, multiple crowns and implants.

After spending time at Cincinnati Shriners and researching Shriners International, he decided to become a Shriner. Dr. Beck said, "I wanted to be part of an organization that has a mission to help kids and do the right thing when no one is watching." He is currently a Mason and working his way up to become a Shriner.

Lexington Shriners Hospital patient named Volunteer of the Year

Olivia Noble, a 16-year -old patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Lexington has been named Volunteer of the Year by the American Red Cross - Eastern Kentucky Chapter. Olivia has volunteered a total of 500 hours in 2016 without missing one day of school! "I chose to volunteer with the Red Cross five years ago. I wanted to help others without expecting anything in return. I also wanted to show other young people in my community the importance of helping your neighbor," said Olivia.

Olivia has been a patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Lexington since she was 4 months old, after being born with club feet. "We all have challenges and we all can be successful depending on how we choose to overcome our obstacles. There is no limit to my ability," Olivia said.

Growing up, Olivia has been on the receiving end of bullying due to her physical disabilities; particularly with the way she runs. Instead of allowing the bully to bring her spirits down, she found hope and healing through her volunteer efforts. Olivia has accomplished so much in five years with the Red Cross and is now certified to assist with house fires by helping the victim(s) find a place to stay and delivering food boxes to disaster victims. She also received certification from the Red Cross in CPR and first aid. She and her volunteer leader will be teaching certification classes in the summer of 2017.

Olivia plans to become a patient ambassador for Shriners Hospitals for Children — Lexington and join the #CutTheBull campaign to help raise awareness of the challenges children with disabilities face and give patients the confidence they need to not only see the ability in themselves but in others as well. Olivia says that her favorite volunteer outreach program is during the holiday season when she gets to wrap and deliver gifts to low income homes and the terminally ill at the VA hospital. "I will continue to volunteer with the American Red Cross until they throw me out," said Olivia.

Patient gives back to hospital

Kallie Mullins, 18-year-old patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Lexington, recently presented a custom wood burning plaque as a token of her appreciation to the hospital and staff. Kallie has her own company called Out of the Woods, creating custom pyrography – the art of decorating wood or other materials with burn marks. The Lexington Shriners Hospital is now the proud owner of a custom piece by Kallie and plans to display the art at the new medical center – opening in April 2017.



Kallie presented the plaque to the hospital on September 23, at the 10th Annual Island Luau Ball. "I want to thank the doctors and staff of Shriners Hospitals for helping me with my disability so that I can walk through life as a braver person," said Kallie. "You have given me so much care and love, and today I want to give back to you."

Kallie has been a patient of the Lexington Shriners Hospital for many years, receiving expert care for brachial



plexus injury. The brachial plexus is a network of nerves that originates in the neck region and branches off to form most of the other nerves that control movement and sensation in the upper limbs, including the shoulder, arm, and hand.

She has joined the hospital's nationwide #CutTheBull campaign to help all children with disabilities find their ability, like she has with pyrography. Kallie wears the 2016 campaign t-shirt proudly and looks forward to continuing to inspire others with her custom pyrography.




