

David I. Coren Memorial Scholarship

Competitive, merit-based awards for outstanding students who show significant interest in, and potential for, employment in the On -Site Power Generation industry.

OVERVIEW / OBJECTIVE

The objective of the scholarship is to provide financial assistance to students who plan to seek employment in the On-Site Power Generation industry after completion of their studies. In awarding scholarships, the committee looks at each application and supporting documents to identify those students who demonstrate that they are taking the necessary steps towards this goal.

EGSA scholarships are awarded once each year in July for the upcoming academic year. With the exception of the Financial Aid form, all application materials must be received by June 1st.

WHAT IS ON-SITE ELECTRIC POWER GENERATION

"On-site electric power generation" can be defined as: Any method of producing power that will be used on or near the site at which it is generated. This includes many non-utility applications, from peak shaving, to emergency standby, to CHP (cogeneration), to industrial power, to large-scale uninterruptible power, and others. Typically, on-site power generation systems consist of a diesel- or natural gaspowered engine that drive a generator, but can encompasses alternative power sources such as wind, solar, and fuel cells.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be high school graduates (or GED equivalent), full-time students at an accredited school, show academic achievement, demonstrate admirable characteristics, and plan to seek employment in the On-Site Power Generation industry. Recipients are not prohibited from accepting scholarship or financial aid or assistance from other sources. Students who have received EGSA Scholarships in prior years are eligible in subsequent years. (Individuals who have received an EGSA Scholarship in the past should contact EGSA for a Renewal Application.)

Former military personnel who have training in the power generation industry and who are pursuing additional formal education for it, and previous EGSA Scholarship recipients, will be given extra consideration for Scholarship assistance.

Applicants must:

• be enrolled (or Accepted) as a full-time student at an accredited Vocational—Technical School, Community College, or two- or four-year institution. Students who will be entering their first year of studies must include an acceptance letter from the school

- have declared a major related to On-Site Power Generation industry subjects
- have (and will be expected to maintain) a cumulative GPA of 2.8 (A = 4) or above. The basis used for the award of a scholarship is merit (academic and personal achievement).

ACADEMIC TRANSCRIPTS REQUIRED

A copy of your **Transcript(s)** must accompany your application. (If you are entering your first year of On-Site Power Generation-related studies, you must submit your High School transcript and copies of any college transcripts for courses you have taken and a copy of the Letter of Acceptance from your school.)

ESSAY REQUIRED

A brief essay must accompany your application. The essay will address the reasons for your desire to work in On-Site Power Generation and your skills and competencies.

CONFIDENTIAL REFERENCES REQUIRED

Two Confidential References are required for your application to be considered. Only one may be from a faculty member; the second, a non-family reference who has known the applicant for a significant period of time.

AWARD NOTIFICATION and PAYMENT

Applicants will be advised if they will be awarded a scholarship via a letter mailed to them in late August.

Payment will be made in the form of a check made payable to the school with instructions to post the payment to the student's account. EGSA Scholarship disbursements must be applied to the recipient's tuition and/or fees. Checks will be mailed to the schools not later than September 1st.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Applicants are responsible for gathering and ensuring that all necessary information is submitted. It is important to answer every question as completely as possible. All information submitted is confidential.

Application Instructions

This application packet is NOT intended for use by individuals who have received an EGSA Scholarship in the past. Individuals who have received an EGSA Scholarship in the past should contact EGSA for a Renewal Application.

Applicants are responsible for gathering and submitting all necessary information. You will be evaluated on the information you supply, so it is important to answer every question as completely as possible. All information submitted is confidential. We will not process your scholarship application unless you accurately and thoroughly complete the application and fulfill all related requirements. The last page of this Application Packet is a checklist that is provided for your convenience.

Once you have gathered the required documents, mail the completed package to EGSA at the address below. Except for the Financial Aid Form, the deadline for receipt of all materials is June 1st. Applications postmarked after that date will be returned. The deadline for the Financial Aid Form is July 1st.

- 1. Complete all Sections of this Scholarship Application form. It is through this information that the selection committee will "get to know" you, so think carefully about your responses and write clear, well-organized answers. *All responses (except signatures) must be typed or neatly printed*. **However, the essay must be typed.**
- 2. Obtain a letter of acceptance from your school if you are a student who is entering your first year of studies related to On-Site Power Generation industry subjects. You will then forward it to us as part of your Application.
- 3. Identify two people to serve as your references. Ideal references include a faculty member in your current educational program (only one), former teachers, or supervisors at places you work or have worked. Give each person one of the enclosed Confidential Reference Forms. **Do not give them to relatives or members of your family; they are not eligible to serve as a reference.** Your references may forward them to us or give them to you to forward to us. Be sure that your references are aware that the forms are part of your application package and must be **postmarked June 1 or before.**
- 4. Applications must include a copy of your Transcripts. Because Scholarship recipients may be asked to provide an Official Transcript before funds are dispersed, you may wish to send an Official Transcript with your application. If you choose to send an Official Transcript, allow the registrar enough time (usually three or four weeks) to provide you with a completed official transcript.
- 5. Complete Part I of the Financial Aid Form and give it to a Financial Aid Officer at your school and ask them to provide the information requested. The Financial Aid Officer is expected to send completed Financial Aid Form to EGSA. **The deadline for the Financial Aid Form is July 1st.**
- 6. Please do not staple anything to the application forms. **Do Not** include photographs.
- 7. Before mailing your application make sure that you have included all required documents and that you have signed the application. We will only accept original documents, faxed materials will not be considered.
