On June 24th, St. John the Baptist's Day, Dunedin Masonic Lodge inducted 4 members into the Order of the Rusty Nail. The event was well attended. A delicious chicken dinner was prepared and served by the ladies of the Order of the Eastern Star.

This was a new ceremony changed to address the valuable criticisms arising from the previous ceremony. I would like to describe how the ceremony proceeded.

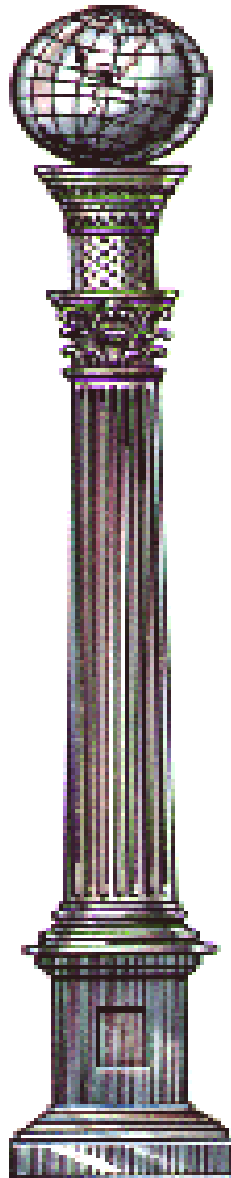
The Lodge was tyled and opened in the Order of the Rusty Nail which is restricted to Master Masons only.

The candidates were prepared and received in due form. The Worshipful Master welcomed them and set the tone of the ceremony. The Chaplain led the Lodge in prayer and the candidates were conducted to the Junior Warden.

The Junior Warden recalled how they were received in the Entered Apprentice Degree and illustrated the step, due guard and sign of an EAM. He then explained the working tools of this degree. The candidates with the assistance of the Senior Deacon and Junior Warden emulated the step due guard and sign of an EAM.

The Brothers were then conducted to the Senior Warden who recalled how they were received as Fellow Craft Masons. He illustrated the step, due guard and sign of a FCM. The Senior Warden then explained the working tools of this degree. The three precious jewels of a Fellow Craft were called to mind. Lastly the candidates with the assistance of the Senior Deacon and Senior Warden emulated step, due guard and sign of a FCM.

The candidates were then conducted to the Worshipful Master in the East. The Worshipful Master recalled how they were received in the Master Mason degree and illustrated the step, due guard and sign of a Master Mason. He also presented the working tools of this degree. With the assistance of the Senior Deacon and Worshipful Master the Brothers exemplified the step, due guard and sign of a MM.



The candidates were then conducted West of the altar and shown how the Great Lights are displayed in each of the degrees. Seats were provided for the candidates to receive the lecture from the Worshipful Master, Senior Warden and Junior Warden.

The Brothers were then conducted to the Worshipful Master who proceeded to invest them with the grips and words of a Mason. the candidates were given the opportunity to ask questions and review what they had come through. Then they were given the charge of the Order of the Rusty Nail.

The Worshipful Master added his own charges and gave each candidate his own compasses, corn, wine, oil, and trowel. the charges were my specific thoughts and desires and are presented below.

I charge you to practice Masonry everyday. To subdue your passions, take care of yourself, find joy and spread brotherly love to all you encounter.

Circumscribe your desires and keep your passions within due bounds toward all mankind. Specifically, do not let anger exceed due bounds. Hold your passionate viewpoints with an open mind and be open to hearing the passionate viewpoints of others.

Nourish yourself daily. Nourish your body, mind and soul. Refresh yourself daily to restore what you have expended in your labors. Seek joy in every day. Spread brotherly love every day.

The Brothers were then given a chance to speak and escorted to seats among the brethren. Introductions were made and the Lodge closed in due form.

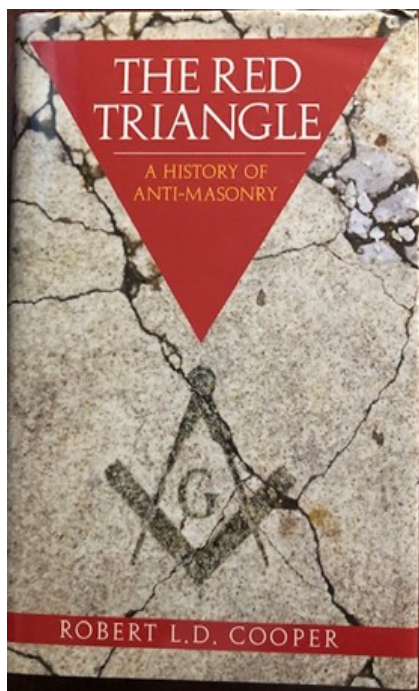
FROM THE SOUTH

Secretary's Notes

Brothers,

The Lodge has been Dark for the last two months and now is the time to start thinking of the Brothers you want to run the Lodge in 2020.

As most of you know the rules have changed in the last couple of years and the following is a simple recap;

Nominations for the five Elected Officers must be made in, in writing, to the Lodge Secretary prior to the November Stated Meeting. You can request a form or simply write the Brothers name and the office you are nominating him for. You must include you name and signature, and a statement from the nominated Brother stating that he will accept the office if elected and his signature must be included.

Dues notices will be coming out in October and please be aware that due to an increase in the Grand Lodge Per-Capita assessment that there will be a five dollar increase in Lodge dues to \$125. The increase will be stepped up five dollars each year for four more years.

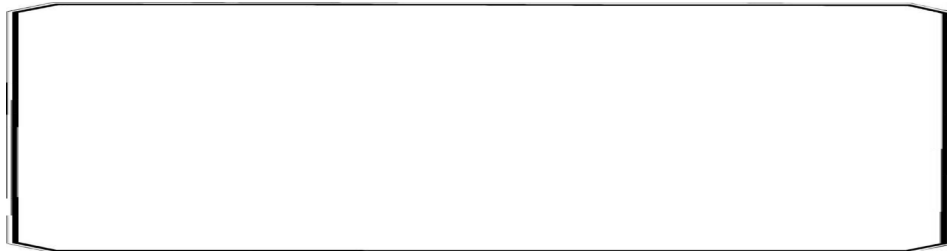

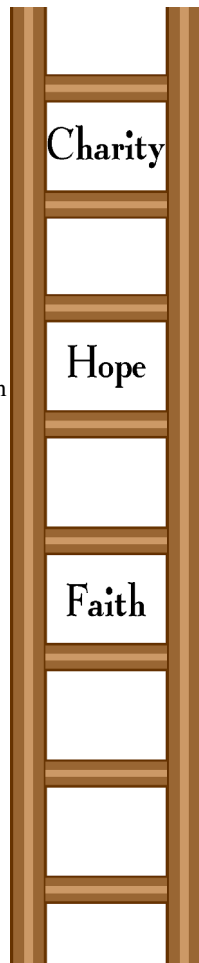
