Workshop Description:

This half day session will provide administrators of early learning programs a hands on experience in identifying characteristics of their program that potentially increase the risk for early childhood suspension or expulsion and planning systemic changes to minimize this risk. Participants will start with a program self-assessment. The self-assessment results will guide exploration and use of the online toolkit, “Preventing Suspensions and Expulsions in Early childhood Settings” and planning strategies that will address the needs of individual programs. This is NOT and in-depth behavior training intended for practitioners, it is an orientation for administrators to a free on line tool kit.

Workshop Outcomes:

Participants will be able to:

- Complete a program self-assessment of policies, practices and needs related to preventing suspension and expulsion of young children
- Match the results of the self-assessment to potential strategies to address program needs
- Plan at least one program strategy to increase the capacity of their program to meet the needs of all children.

Presenter:

Dr. Abby Schachner has written and published extensively on the social and emotional development of young children and is a frequent presenter at national and international professional conferences. She has given presentations to a wide variety of audiences on strategies for analyzing and using data for program improvement and on integrating data across agencies and initiatives in order to answer critical policy questions. Her work has been published in *Merrill-Palmer Quarterly*, *The Handbook of Cognition and Emotion*, *The Handbook of Prosocial Education: Developing Caring, Capable Citizens*. She has also co-authored chapters in *Developmental Psychology: An Advanced Textbook* and *Social and Personality Development: An Advanced Textbook*.

Dr. Schachner earned her Ph.D. in human development with an emphasis on social and emotional development in early childhood from the University of California, Davis and holds a B.A. degree in psychology from Georgetown University.
