## Ponderosa High School Instrumental Music

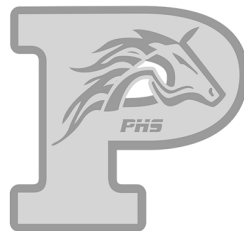
