These latest church buzzwords (Attractional & Missional) might be dismissed as just another passing fad. We've had lots of church growth programs developed and tried over the last 40 years in an effort to advance the mission of Christ. All were noble endeavors, but many have long since been shelved like 8-track cassette tapes.

Within our shifting culture, the church is finding itself not only in a post-Christian society, but also a post-Christendom world. Pluralism, the byproduct of postmodernism, has taken its grip on the thinking of millions living in the west. Although the western European churches feel the effects of pluralism to a far greater degree, we, in the US, are not immune. It's estimated that 3,500 churches are closing their doors permanently every year.

But not is all lost. The future for the church is not bleak. In fact, now may be the greatest opportunity for the church to grow and to follow the mission of Christ. Many have noted that the present is very similar to the times of the early church when there was rapid growth throughout the Roman Empire. The early church's methods of ministry may be needed now.

A few local churches and their leaders are carefully studying these trends. Their strategy for ministry might be summarized in a catchy phrase – “The church has left the building.” These few churches realize that in a pluralistic society, people aren't seeking out the church anymore. The church is no longer central to the community. The church has been pushed to the margins. Therefore, these churches are moving their ministries outside the walls of the church into all sorts of different places and venues. It is surprising where they have found receptive and fruitful ministry area.


Our church leaders, here at our church, sense that our opportunity is knocking. In the next few months there will be various exploring and learning sessions for all of us to get up to speed on what it might mean for our church to add and welcome missional ideas to our ministry. We will need to see what of our current and new ministries can be “taken on the road,” so to speak. Others have found that taking their ministries into the community is very effective in finding people who want Christ in their life, but don't know what that's about or how to make it happen. There have to be people like that right here in the Naples community.

So, let's all commit ourselves to investing of ourselves in finding what being “missional” means, and how we might implement it here at the Naples SDA Church. On that – stay tuned!

Love and Money (part 1)

We have heard Frank Sinatra croon this romantic ballad-“Love and marriage, love and marriage go together like a horse and carriage, this I tell you, brother, you can't have one without the other.” As we celebrate love during this month of romance, let us remember that an understanding of money is important in the marriage ‘carriage’ since this often the number one cause of marital dysfunction. Over the next two months we will portray the different financial personalities with their strengths and weaknesses. **SUSIE SAVER** – One of the challenges of Susie Saver is her tendency to think of life only in terms of dollars and cents. Sometimes, spending money for fun such as vacation will seem frivolous to her, but enjoying the outing and not pushing aside the feelings and needs of the people in her life are her rewards. Because a Susie Saver has a very hard time parting with money, she can come across to other people as a miser, cheap, and stingy. She also appears petty and judgmental as she compares her spending habits to others. **SAMMY SPENDER** – As you would expect, Sammy Spender has a relationship with money matters that is exactly opposite of Susie Saver. Everybody loves to be around a Sammy Spender because he is generous and spontaneous. Typical of a spender, when it comes to shopping, Sammy Spender does not keep a running total of his purchases; he just keeps spending. He doesn't think about the practicality or the cost of the items he buys, but thinks more on how he can impress the receiver. Sammy Spender lives in the moment. He spends on impulse, doesn't make a list, and never accounts how much he can spend. He neither searches for the best deal nor bothers to wait for next week's sale. **RANDY RISK TAKER** – Randy Risk Taker is in the same category as Donald Trump, Bill Gates, and Steve Forbes. He may not be as successful or as wealthy as they are, but like them, he knows that the fastest way to make money is to take chances and risks on investments, real estate deals, or business opportunities. He knows what he wants and how to make economic decisions quickly. If you have a personality like Randy Risk Taker you need to be aware of some blind spots. Be mindful that you can be very vulnerable to scam artists. Impatience is another trait of a Risk Taker. They can never understand why others don't see the opportunity, which leads them to think that other individuals are neither as smart nor as savvy with money as they are.
