Plant Project

The quality of the landscape in front of the church has been declining over the years since the building opened. To help us bring it back to its original, beautiful, state, we worked with a local landscaper to come up with a plan. The plan is not cheap, not in the budget, and it will take the full support of the congregation to raise enough funds to complete. Flags are placed around the front to represent components of this plan: **orange flags** are for shrubs, **white flags** are for sod and top soil, **pink flags** are for rock and mulch. The **orange flags** are a \$30 donation, the **white** are a \$25 donation, and the **pink** are a \$15 donation. We are two weeks into donations and are 20% of the way to the goal.
