In the foyer: prints of Ellen's drawings of seaweeds and photos of plants she found together with their science and history.

9:00-18:00 ORGANICO CAFÉ (CLOSED SUN)– ART EXHIBITION: DRAWING FROM NATURE

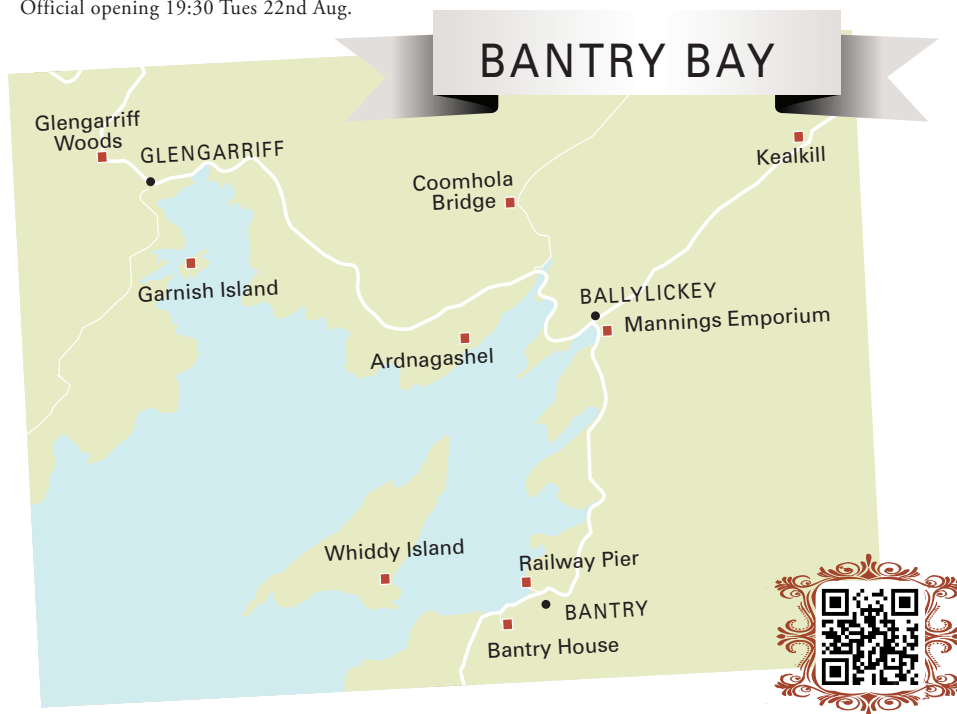
