

UUCA 6th-grade RE learns peace-building through “ultimate” sport



For the past two Sundays, UUCA’s 6th-grade RE classes have explored a novel way to build peace--through sports. This focus on peace-building is part of the 6th-grade RE’s study of the 6th Principle, “the goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all.”

On Sunday 3/5, the group welcomed an H-B Woodlawn student who related her experiences in Israel at “Camp Ultimate Peace,”

where the sport of Ultimate (Frisbee) serves as a vehicle for bringing together Palestinian, Arab-Israeli, and Jewish-Israeli youth. The student, Miranda, shared stories and photos illustrating how Ultimate’s emphasis on cooperation, respect, and “spirit of the game” allows Israeli and Palestinian youth a safe context for developing understanding and friendship.

The following Sunday 3/12, the 6th-graders went to a local park to practice the basics of Ultimate, coached by three other high-schoolers: Abby of Washington-Lee, Fiona of H-B Woodlawn, and UUCA Youth Group member **Chloe Fugle**. The Ultimate training session ended in a “spirit circle,” a post-game ritual between opposing teams that emphasizes players’ mutual respect despite the competitive setting.
