Market reports and commercial publications.

Market quotations, tabulations, lists, directories, or other published compilations generally used and relied upon by the public or by persons in the witness's particular occupation.

O.C.G.A § 24-9-901 (b) (1) "Testimony of a witness with knowledge that a matter is what it is calmed to be."

Elliott Assoc., L.P. v. Banco de la Nacion, 194 F.R.D. 116, 121 (S.D.N.Y. 2000) (Bloomberg website admitted to prove certain interest rates).

Courts also may take judicial notice of the information posted on commercial websites whose accuracy cannot reasonably be questioned. O.C.G.A § 24-2-201. See e.g., O'Toole v. Northrop Grumman Corp., 499 F.3d 1218, 1224-25 (10<sup>th</sup> Cir.2007) Jaycee Atlanta Development v. Providence Bank, 330 Ga.App.322 (2014).

Courts do not allow public records to be authenticated with uncertified copies of pages from the public agency's website.
