
### **LEND Training**

# Community-based training

END training requires hands-on experiences in everyday community settings that provide interdisciplinary services to families and children and youth who are at risk for or who have developmental and behavioral disorders, including ASD.

Community sites specify what types of training and clinical activities will be of most help.



## Who oversees LEND Training?

LEND faculty members are expert university-based clinicians and educators who provide training and supervision to LEND trainees in their work in community sites. LEND faculty will work with trainees and community staff members to assure that both trainees and sites benefit from collaborating in the LEND Training Program.
