Building

Open to a single or related group of buildings including new construction, renovations and restorations.

Interior Architecture

To recognize the excellence and diversity of interior projects by Architects. Interiors that have been submitted for a Building Award, or have previously received an award are not eligible.

Low Budget / Small Project

To recognize design excellence within the constraints of small budget, scale and size. Final construction costs must be submitted. Small projects must be under 2,000 sq.ft. in size. Submission must have been executed for a client and may include interior projects.

Unbuilt Project Award

Projects including those commissioned for compensation or research and design competitions that are unbuilt to date.

Student Project Award

Graduate student project, must be AIA Student member, and a student at a Michigan university on or before June 14, 2016 to be eligible for submission.

25 Year

For distinguished projects designed by an AIA Member prior to 1990 and used for at least 25 years for the same purpose for which they were designed.

Michigan Steel

This award recognizes design excellence through the innovative use of steel products with architecture created by AIA Michigan architects and their engineers, contractors and fabricators.

Sheet Metal Award

The Sheet Metal industry plays an important role within the systems and aesthetic development of Architecture.

This award recognizes Design Excellence through those systems and materials as significant in the formation of an architectural or interior design. Projects will be recognized for the innovative use of state of the art climate control/system design, ACM metal architectural panels, rainscreens, siding and roofing and ornamental metal visually in a historical context.

Eligibility. All entries must be projects designed by Licensed Michigan Architects, within firms that satisfy section 2010(1) of the State Licensing Act. (Student award submissions are exempt from licensure requirement)

The projects may be located anywhere in the world. Building projects that are integrated with the surrounding natural landscape environment are eligible for consideration for up to five consecutive years from the year of completion. Interior Architecture projects are eligible for consideration for up to three consecutive years from the year of completion. Projects that won awards in other programs or were submitted in prior years to this program are eligible. Prior award winners in this program are ineligible. When one architect is not the sole author, all other participants substantially contributing to the design of the project must be given credit as part of the submission.

Submission Nominees must submit one, digital-only nomination. Entrants shall submit a maximum of 15 images and power point slides per design project and download to the AIA Michigan FTP site. PowerPoint format no larger than 50 MB. Images should not exceed 1024x768 pixel resolution and 96 dots per inch. File name and project name must be the same.

Complete instructions will be sent via email once entry form is received.

Date & Fee. Submit entry form and fee for each building project and for each nomination entry to AIAMI by March 23, 2017. Specific instructions will be forwarded to all entrants immediately. Refer to the registration form for fees. All submissions and nominations must be received by March 23, 2017. Entry fees include one plaque per award. Additional plaques will be available for a fee.

Jury. The Jury will be composed of prominent architects from outside of Michigan.

Awards. All awards are called "Honor Awards." Criteria for evaluating design achievements include the demonstration of exemplary skill and sensitivity in resolution of formal, functional and technical requirements and/or the advancement of the contemporary understanding of design by proposing new approaches to the development of architectural form.

Gold Medal Award

The Gold Medal is the highest honor awarded to an AIAMI architect by AIA Michigan in recognition of most distinguished service to the profession of architecture or to AIA Michigan. The Gold Medal may be awarded posthumously.

Robert F. Hastings Award

Named in honor of the late Robert F. Hastings FAIA, first recipient of the Institute's Kemper Award, and given in recognition of distinguished service, to an AIAMI Architect, who has significantly contributed to the Architectural Profession. Current members of the AIAMI Board are not eligible. The Hastings Award may be given posthumously.

President's Award

To recognize an architect who has made outstanding contributions to the profession and service to the community, through education or corporate practice. Must be a member of AIAMI and dedicated to its ideals.

Balthazar Korab Award

This award is named in honor of Balthazar Korab, architect and photographer, who spent his career breathing life into architecture and the built environment. This Award is given in recognition of an individual's significant effort and contribution to Architecture and/or the Arts.

Young Architect Award

To recognize proficiency and exceptional accomplishments in, and contributions to the profession by an architect who has been a member of AIAMI for a minimum of three years and is 40 years old or younger during the calendar year of the award.

Associate Member Award

To recognize proficiency and exceptional accomplishments in, and contributions to the profession by an associate who has been a member of AIAMI for a minimum of two years.

Honorary Affiliate Member Award

To a person who is not eligible for AIA membership but who has given distinguished service to the profession of architecture or the allied arts and sciences.

Nominations for the above recognitions may be made by any AIAMI member other than the nominee. The entry shall be a portfolio in a full-vu binder that includes a biography, examples of work in a photographic 8" x 10" format, and three letters of recommendation.

Firm Award

An AIAMI member, group of members, chapter or committee may nominate a firm that has consistently produced distinguished architecture. Firms who satisfy section 2010(1) of the state licensing act, or that have been reorganized and whose names have been changed and modified, are eligible, as long as the firm has been in operation for a period of at least 10 years. The jury will focus on the quality of the firm's architecture and not on the principals of the firm. Required submittal:

- a letter of nomination summarizing the firm's contributions
- a brief biography of all firm's principals and a history of the firm
- descriptive statements & photographs of early, middle and recent work of the firm
- miscellaneous material that describes why this firm qualifies for this award
- one CD profiling work and a firm brochure

IDP Firm Award

To recognize firms of any size that demonstrate support for their IDP interns through training, mentoring and advising. Nominations can be made by any IDP coordinator, IDP student or intern, AIAMI member or a chapter. The submission shall be in the form of a letter of up to three pages addressed to the President that outlines the extraordinary efforts of the firm to train their IDP Interns.

Submit registration form and fee for each building project and for each nomination entry to AIAMI by February 15, 2017. Specific instructions will be forwarded to all entrants immediately. Refer to the registration form for fees. All submissions and nominations must be received by March 23, 2017. Entry fee includes one plaque per award recipient. Additional plaques will be available for a fee.
