MOST REVEREND KEVIN VANN, Bishop, Diocese of Orange

Bishop Vann is a member of the USCCB Committee on Migration, as well as the Committee on Catholic Education, the Committee on Canonical Affairs & Church Governance, the Task Force on Health Care and the Subcommittee on Health Care Issues. He is a member of the USCCB 2016 Special Assembly Planning Committee. Bishop Vann has served since 2011 as the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith's Ecclesiastical Delegate for the Pastoral Provision in the United States. He is also chairman of the Board of Directors of the Catholic Legal Immigration Network, Inc. (CLINIC). He served from 2007 to 2014 on the International Dominican Foundation's Board of Directors.



VINCENT NGUYEN, D.O., C.M.D., Hoag Hospital

Dr. Vincent D. Nguyen is a Board Certified Palliative Medicine Specialist with Board Certifications in Geriatrics and Family Medicine. He earned his Medical Degree from Western University of Health Sciences in 1992 and recently completed a 2-year CHCF Fellowship in Health Care Leadership from UC San Francisco. He is the Director of the HOAG CARES Program and in this role provides direct medical care as well as oversight of the inpatient and outpatient palliative clinical services at HOAG hospitals. He is a founding member of the UCI Palliative Medicine Fellowship program for post-graduate and mid-career physicians to learn and teach the art of caring for people living with serious illness; He also serves as a volunteer Clinical Professor at the UCI School of Medicine. He co-chairs the Orange County Advance Care Planning Partners since 2009 to inform and educate the public on the value of advance care planning. He has several publications in the Journals on Palliative Medicine and co-authored several chapters in 2 books on End-of Life issues published by the McGraw-Hill Companies. Dr. Vincent Nguyen's passion outside of medicine include golf outings with his 3 daughters, yoga classes with his wife of 26 years, silent retreats and naps on weekends.



KRISTYN FAZZALARO, L.C.S.W., A.C.H.P., Hoag Hospital

Kristyn Fazzalaro is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker who has been working with patients and families for 17 years, providing counseling, advocacy and support in the face of serious illness. Kristyn holds a Master of Social Work from California State University Long Beach, and a specialist certification in Hospice and Palliative Medicine. Kristyn completed a Fellowship for Social Work leaders at NYU where she focused on improving communication in the care of critically ill patients. Kristyn currently serves as the program Manager for the CARES program and Oncology Support Services programs at Hoag Hospital. She and her husband Bill are parishioners at St Edward the Confessor and their daughter Anna attends the Parish School.



REVEREND JACK SEWELL, Priest, Diocese of Orange

Fr. Jack Sewell is a priest of the Diocese of Orange, California. He was ordained in 1978, and was assigned at St. Kilian, St. Justin Martyr, St. Irenaeus, Our Lady of Fatima, and St. Joseph Placentia Parishes, as well as in the Office of Canonical Services. He currently ministers on weekends as the contract priest at the School of Infantry West, USMC Camp Pendleton, CA, and part-time weekdays at St. Joseph Hospital, Orange, CA. He has served as Chairman of the Council of Priests, as a member of the Priest's Retirement Plan Committee, and on the Permanent Deaconate Board. Fr. Jack also served for thirty years in the U.S. Air Force Reserve Chaplain Corps. He comes from an Air Force family with his father retiring after twenty-six years of active duty, and a brother retiring after twenty years of active duty. Fr.
