



Marquette University Summer Communication, Literacy and Enhanced Socialization Camp

Children with autism, ages 6 to 11-years-old, are invited to attend a specialized summer literacy and social communication camp.

ENROLLMENT IS LIMITED— REGISTER BY May 5th (this date has been extended).

Who can participate?

- Children 6 to 11 years old, who are diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder, have a current Individualized Education Plan (IEP), and speak English consistently and flexibly

What will they do?

- Participate in one initial intake session lasting 1.5-2 hours prior to camp. This will include cognitive, literacy, language and social communication assessment. Parents will also participate in an interview and complete questionnaires about their child and themselves
- Attend 12 days of camp, 3.5 hours per day, 4 days per week, for 3 weeks, including individual, small group, and classroom activities. Class size is 10-12 students
- The camp is based on the Start-to-Finish literacy curriculum targeting phonological awareness, word study, vocabulary, comprehension, and fluency skills
- Additional activities will include art, games, and social activities with language skills addressed during all tasks.
- Have the opportunity to learn and interact with other children with and without autism

Who will teach the camp?

- The camp will be run by Marquette University faculty and students

How much does the camp cost?

- Cost of the 12 day camp is \$180 payable to Marquette University *prior* to start of camp
