Juried Artist Member Exhibition 2019

January 14: Intake of work Monday, 9:00am – 6:30pm

January 15: Work judged, all artists notified starting Tuesday after 4:00pm

January 16: Work not selected to be picked up Wednesday, 9:00am – 5:00pm

January 18: Exhibition opens: Opening Reception **Friday**, 5:30 – 8:00pm

March 2: Final day of the exhibition.

March 4: Pick up unsold work Monday, 9:00am – 5:00pm

ELIGIBILITY

The juried exhibition is open to Artist Members of the Cultural Center whose membership is valid through March 4, 2019. For membership information, visit the Cultural Center website at www.ccpvb.org. All works entered MUST be submitted by the end of intake day and MUST remain up for the duration of the exhibition or they are not eligible to be included in the judging.

LIMITATIONS

All works must be originals, no reproductions will be allowed. All media is eligible, however, artists are responsible for providing any installation instructions and special equipment, including electronic equipment that the work requires. Work must be exhibition-ready with hanging devices installed (anchored screws on either end with hanging wire attached ONLY.) **The Cultural Center will not accept works that do not have proper hanging equipment.**

Art Submissions may NOT in any way:

- a. Be worked on by another artist or art instructor
- b. Be a copy of any other artists' work
- c. Be based upon photographs, other than those that are the right and legal property of the entrant.
- d. Be previously submitted for **any** exhibitions held at the Cultural Center.

SIZE RESTRICTIONS

All 2-dimensional works must be under 60" high and 60" wide. All 3-dimensional works must be under 72" high, 40" deep and 40" wide. Works that do not conform to these guidelines will not be eligible for entry.

ENTRY FEES

Artist members can submit up to TWO pieces of work with no fee. Each additional submission will require a \$30 non-refundable fee. Up to FIVE pieces may be submitted. All fees are due when work is dropped off at the Cultural Center.

DATES

All works submitted must be completed within the last 3 years. Works created before 2016 will not be accepted.

SUBMISSION PROCESS

Artist members will submit their artwork to be juried on January 18th. Submitted works must follow all guidelines, have signature blocked out, and have an entry form filled out for each piece. **Electronic image submissions of work in place of the physical work will NOT be accepted.** Works not selected during judging must be picked up January 20th.

INTAKE

Works must be hand-delivered to the Cultural Center on January 14th, 2019. Each piece must have a submission form filled out. Signatures must be covered to ensure anonymity during judging. Works may not be dropped off before or after intake day. After the close of the exhibition, all unsold works must be picked up on March 4, 2019.

PRIZE

The juror will select one artist to receive a first place award of \$300. The award winner will also be offered a solo exhibition in the Scene Gallery at the Cultural Center during the 2020 exhibition year. The juror will also select a second place with a prize of \$125, and third place with a prize of \$75. All prizes will be awarded at the opening reception on January 18th. Additionally, the Curatorial Committee will select artists for the 2020 Curatorial Choice Exhibition from those exhibiting.

SALES

All works should be priced or valued for insurance purposes. Work not for sale should be noted as such (NFS). Artists will receive a 60% commission on all works sold during the exhibition.

LIABILITY AGREEMENT

Although every effort will be made to insure the safety of the artwork, the Cultural Center assumes no responsibility for damage or deterioration incurred before or after the exhibition or for possible loss in transit. Works will be insured while on exhibition at the Cultural Center.
