PV Arts and Crafts by Winn-Dixie will have my list on hand. They will also give us a discount! Canvas often goes on sale at Michaels in packs and is a good choice. Hobby Lobby not recommended for quality reasons.

Paints – *Large Tube of Titanium White

58ml. tubes

Alizarin Crimson	Cadmium Yellow Light
Burnt Sienna	Viridian Green
Cadmium Red Light	Ultramarine Blue
Cerulean Blue	Yellow Ochre
Raw Umber	Cadmium Red
Cadmium Yellow Medium	Ivory Black
Paynes Grey	

Additional colors optional and are always helpful.

Palette

Disposable Palette with box and palette pages. (Mastersons Sta-Wet is VERY HELPFUL)

You can use paper plates, but used coated paper plates.

Palette Knife – no plastic ones they break get a small metal one to mix paint.

Brushes Acrylic Synthetic

Liquitex Freestyle is a good brand so is Simply Simmons but any will do, even a cheap set of a variety pack of synthetic bristle is a great idea.

Minimal of 6 brushes

Flats, Filberts, Brights in a variety of sizes from #2 to #8 will be great

Canvas:

For the first class you can use a large piece heavy paper or canvas paper. Even getting a pad of canvas paper also called acrylic paper can be good to practice on. Canvas board is not recommended. You will need a: Stretched canvas sized: 9 x 12 or 14 x 18in for your first painting.

Other Materials

*Golden Semi-Gloss Medium, if not Liquitex Gloss Medium

Pencil, Cups for water (2), Rags or paper towels, Disposable gloves
