

Presbytery of Milwaukee elects Rachel Yates as presbytery executive

The Presbytery of Milwaukee has elected Rachel Yates as presbytery executive. In this capacity, she will be responsible for hiring, developing and managing staff, leading strategy for leadership development, building bridges internally and externally, and encouraging risk-taking and innovation, among other responsibilities.

Yates will begin serving in the post on Jan. 1.

Yates had been associate director for program at the Presbyterian Mission Agency in Louisville. She also served as the denomination's west region church support associate. Previous to those positions, she spent 23 years at the law firm of Holland & Hart in Denver, the last 13 years as a partner. Yates has a bachelor of arts in religious studies from Stanford University and a juris doctorate from the Boston University School of Law.
