In a recent study by Vibrant Faith, researchers studied the "camp high" which is experienced after campers go home and how the camper's faith life is changed. The data from over 1,000 campers showed significant growth in numerous measures of faith formation and personal characteristics during the week of camp. Clearwater Forest campers refer to Clearwater Forest as their "home away from home, their "yearly mountain top experience," and "a place to be themselves and grow closer to God."

There is, in fact, a camp high, but we can say with confidence that the camp experience has much stronger lasting impacts than temporary ones.

Young people are participating more deeply in their faith months after camp is over. They have gained something much more valuable: a desire to be in a Christian community, a hunger to learn more, and the assurance that faith makes a difference in their lives.
