

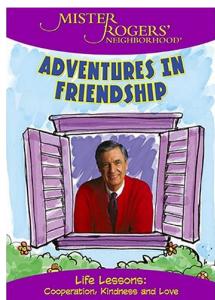
## Rogers says: “Look for the helpers.”

### Mister Rogers' Neighborhood: Adventures in Friendship (DV305)

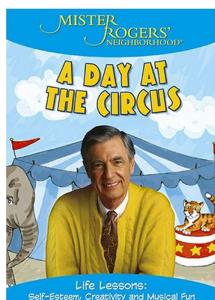

### Mister Rogers' Neighborhood: A Day at the Circus (DV308)

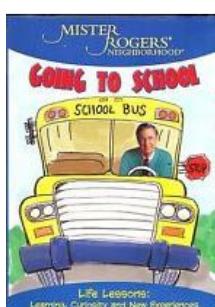

### Mister Rogers' Neighborhood: Going to School (DV309)

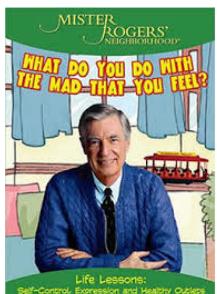
