What is next?

The Clearwater Forest Board of Directors has been busy over the past 14 months developing our "Balanced Scorecard" and visioning for the future. We have also embarked on the first steps to renovate the dining hall with new windows being installed this month.

The new windows feature insulated glass, fewer obstructions, and have dramatically increased the amount of natural light in the dining hall. This project was completed with funds that were

given to Clearwater Forest by the Crosby / Ironton Presbyterian Church when it closed.

The next phase is looking at upgrading the kitchen, accessibility, lighting and office renovation. We have contracted with a local architect firm who will begin to help us make plans for the much needed upgrades.
